Welcome 2021!!! I'm sure looking forward to what the new year brings. Hopefully we can be back to a more normal life style!! The cold months always give the furnace a work out. Remember to get your furnace serviced regularly and change the filter as well. A furnace that isn't working properly can cause deadly odorless gas to enter your home. Make sure you have a functioning Carbon monoxide alarm installed in your house. This is your best protection and gives you an early warning for what could be a very dangerous situation. Test yours and check for an expiration date on it. If your carbon monoxide detector alarms, get everyone out of the house and open some windows for ventilation. Call your gas company and they can test your air quality and advise you as to what to do. You can also call 911 as well. We have been called out for these on several occasions and have found faulty furnaces twice. Other times we found expired alarms or alarms that needed new batteries.

Electric heaters and fireplaces also see increased use in cold weather. Always use common sense with these types of heaters and make sure nothing flammable is near them. Fireplace chimneys should be properly maintained as well as dangerous build ups can start in them and you could have a chimney fire.

GOLFING WITH THE PHYS-ED 20/30

The senior physical education class (Grade 11 & 12) were invited by the Macklin Golf Association to use the golf course (introduction to golf). The class started golfing in September and golfed every

What should I do with the snow from my driveway?

It is the policy of the Town of Macklin to clear snow from all streets as soon as possible after a large snowfall with the equipment available. When clearing the snow from your sidewalks or driveway please make every effort possible to deposit this snow onto your own property.

Please make sure you are visible and give plenty of distance to Town snow removal equipment when clearing streets.






