

- No recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- NO Extensions will be given.
- NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.



Macklin celebrates construction of water main replacement project

June 23, 2022 Issued by the Town of Macklin

Today, the Town of Macklin announced that construction is underway on its Cast Iron Water Main Replacement project, which will benefit every member of the community by improving the delivery of water to homes and businesses.

Work involves the removal of all existing cast iron water main lines and replacement with new pvc water main lines. The project is targeted to be completed and operational later this summer. Work is being done by Gee Bee Construction.

Under the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program, the Government of Canada will be contributing up to \$791,502 toward the project, and the Government of Saskatchewan will be contributing up to \$659,519. The Town of Macklin is responsible for funding the remainder of the project.

"Investments in water infrastructure keep our communities healthy," said the Honourable Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Infrastructure and Communities. "Today marks the beginning of a project that will ensure residents of Macklin have access to clean, reliable drinking water for years to come."

"The Government of Saskatchewan is proud to invest more than \$659,000 toward the Town of Macklin's water line project," said Kindersley MLA Ken Francis on behalf of Government Relations Minister Don McMorris. "Reliable water infrastructure is crucial to meeting the needs of homes and businesses. This improved system will position Macklin for decades of growth."

Carbon Monoxide and Smoke Alarms – Protecting People in Their Homes

Information at a Glance

Effective July 1, 2022, all *buildings* in Saskatchewan with sleeping rooms are required to provide early warning protection against the effects of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, smoke and fire.

The installation of CO and smoke alarms is the most effective way of accomplishing this requirement.

When a *building* with sleeping rooms contains a fuel-burning *appliance*, or an attached vehicle parking garage, CO alarms must be installed:

- inside each sleeping room; <u>OR</u>
- outside each sleeping room within 5 meters (16 feet) of each sleeping room door.

When a *building* contains sleeping rooms, smoke alarms must be installed:


- on each floor level of a building, including the level with sleeping rooms, with the smoke alarm located between the sleeping rooms and the remainder of the floor; <u>AND</u>
- inside each sleeping room.
- Inside each sleeping roor

Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee has been working towards aesthetically improving the entrance into the cemetery. The project that has been initiated will include the relocation and upgrade of the historic entrance gates to the cemetery. The

restoration of the memorial gates and installation of new wrought iron fencing, featuring stone pillars, is our project goal for next year.

The entrance will be relocated to the east boundary opening and will include modern stone pillars to support the restored historic arched iron gates. Every attempt possible will be undertaken to try and relocate the existing stone pillars to a suitable location within the cemetery.

To date donation funds have allowed us to purchase the wrought iron fencing, relocate trees and complete the required survey and elevation drafting. As funds will allow the project will now move towards completion of the stone pillars and wrought iron fencing along the complete east boundary of the cemetery property.

At this moment we are canvassing for donations towards the project and look forward to seeing this worthwhile project completed. The Lakeview Cemetery is a community space that demonstrates our commitment to respectfully commemorate those that have been laid to rest.

The committee has decided to use the individual stone pillars as dedicated commemorative spaces. A donation of \$3,000 will provide individual sponsorship of one ornate stone pillar. A commemorative plaque will be inlaid within the stone pillar to forever recognize your contribution to the project. Seven out of 24 pillars have been spoken for thus far.
