

News from the Hall

Well by the time you read this, January should be in the books. What a crazy month it was for FOG. Please, please use extreme caution when traveling in foggy weather. If the conditions are really bad, please consider how important your trip is and/or could it be put off. If you can wait a couple of hours or until daylight this can make a big difference in driving conditions. Heavy fog can also cause the roads to become very icy which makes the conditions even more dangerous. We have responded to several motor vehicle accidents in dense fog over the past few years. These are some of the most high risk calls we have to respond to. As soon as we have stopped someone on the highway we have created another hazard, as we are worried about the next car coming through the fog and we have to do this on both sides of the accident. If you are driving through fog and you see flares on the side of road, please start to slow down as safely as you can. Turn on your hazard lights and pull off to the side of the road if you can. Proceed slowly and watch for a fireman directing traffic. He will tell you how to proceed. We also have big pink signs that read "Emergency Scene Ahead". If we have time we try to set these on the side of the road but sometimes we don't have enough manpower to do this or it might be to windy to use them. Let's all be a safe as we can out there and use common sense in these conditions!! We would much rather stay home than head to the hall on those really foggy nights.

We responded to a fire in the early hours one morning this past month. It is the first time for me that the automatic sprinkler system was actually activated. It is very reassuring to know that these systems work as they are designed. They made a big difference that night. What could have been a very bad fire was taken care of fairly quickly and most importantly no one was hurt in the incident. I have been on the department for over 20 years and have never seen these systems work before.

Membership wise we have been able to welcome another 2 new members. Keifer Cosh and Kaden Wappel have been to a couple of meetings and they seem like they might be sticking around for a while. Welcome to the hall men. That's all from the hall!! Happy Valentines Day and be safe out there!!

By blowing, shoveling, or moving the snow from your driveway or sidewalk onto the street, you are compounding what already is a daunting task.

Your assistance when removing your snow will allow the Town maintenance staff to quickly and efficiently clean snow from our streets. Please make sure you are visible and give plenty of distance to Town snow removal equipment when clearing streets.

The TOWN OF MACKLIN is now a drop off site for rechargeable and primary batteries.
