News from the Hall

Hello All!

It's a bit strange writing about spring when I am writing this (Feb 22nd) for the March issue and it is minus 27 outside. Every night during these cold snaps the firefighters go to bed with their warm clothes ready beside the bed, thinking please don't let there be a fire tonight. Pumping water when it is extremely cold is difficult, dangerous and hard on equipment and firefighters!! The fire risk is always higher during cold weather because of the increased use of space heaters, block heaters etc. Welcome spring!! With that being said remember to be careful around ice and fast flowing water as the conditions can change very quickly now. Please keep an eye on the young ones when they are out playing near water. They are always tempted to see how good their rubber boots are and they get into trouble in the cold water in a hurry. The edge of the ditches also tend to dry out very quickly and cigarettes tossed out car windows can start fires very easily even if there is snow in the lower part of the ditches.

Training wise we did our annual swim down at the lake The year round use of aeration down at the park means there is open water down there all winter so we usually get four or five members to don the ice rescue suits and go for a swim. This year we got some of the rookies in with some of the veterans. It is always

worthwhile and educational training.

Equipment wise, we have started the process of upgrading the SCBA or air packs we are using. Some of the old packs we are using are over 35 years old and were donated to us after they were used for oil field work .Whenever we can upgrade you always see the advancements that have happened over the years in the new tools. The new packs are easier to maintain, lighter to wear and the amount of working time we have with the newer bottles doubles from 20 minutes to 40 minutes. Our crew have been in several structure fires in the last few years with these old packs and this will make them safer and give them more time to do what they have to in the buildings. The cost of this project is going to be around \$85,000.00 and we will be phasing in the new packs over the next few years. We already have had some generous donations that will help with the costs but more donations are always welcome.

That's all from the hall. Happy spring!! Be safe out there!!




