# **Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project**

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee has been moving forward with the cemetery improvement plan as time and funds allow. Currently the concrete pilings for the stone pillars have been installed and initial landscaping is underway. The original entrance sign leading into the cemetery has been repaired and installed in its new location.

The committee has decided to use the individual stone pillars as dedicated commemorative spaces available for sponsorship. There are 26 permanent stone pillars being constructed to support the wrought-iron perimeter fence. Through a donation of \$3,000 a commemorative plague will be inlaid within a stone pillar to forever recognize your contribution towards this project.

To date, 12 pillars have been purchased leaving the remaining 14 available. If you have been thinking about providing a donation to this project please don't delay, the last available pillars are available on a first come basis.






#### U11 Tier 3 Boys—Provincial Champions


