

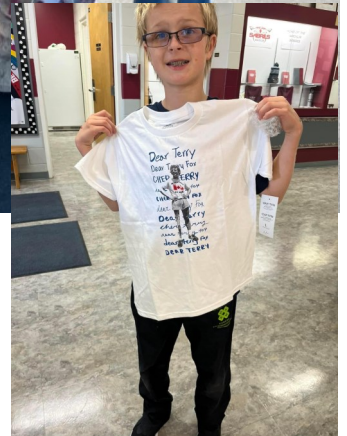
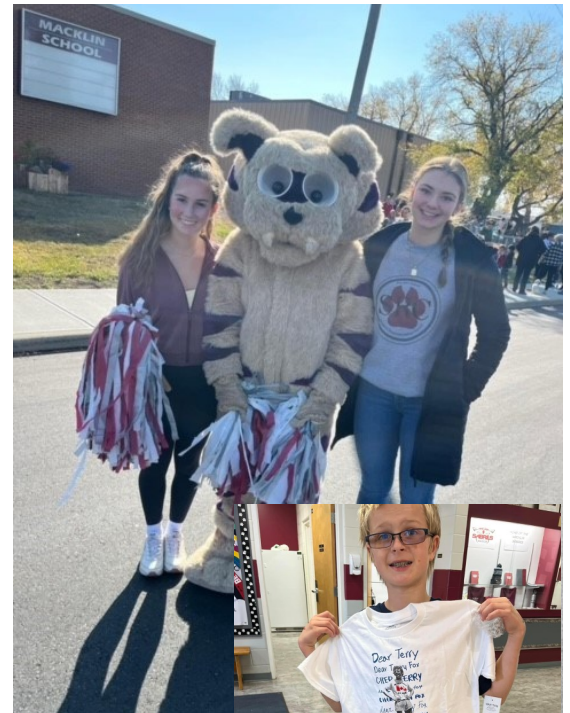

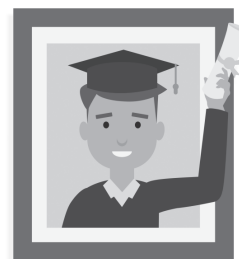

Each year the SRC spends Halloween canvassing the town for donations to the Macklin Food Bank. We will be starting this year's canvas at 6 pm. If you will be away that evening, feel free to leave items on your steps or drop off at the school between 8 am and 4 pm. Consider donating canned or boxed food, personal care items (shampoo, soap, tampons, diapers, etc.) cleaning supplies, or paper products (paper towel, toilet paper, Kleenex). Monetary donations will also be accepted.

Thank you for ensuring that any food items donated are not expired. We do our best to ensure that we do not miss a house during the drive, however, if your home is missed, donations are always accepted at Macklin Coop Food Store.

Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee has been moving forward with the cemetery improvement plan as time and funds allow. Currently the concrete pilings for the stone pillars have been installed and initial landscaping is underway. The original entrance sign leading into the cemetery has been repaired and installed in its new location.

The committee has decided to use the individual stone pillars as dedicated commemorative spaces available for sponsorship. There are 26 permanent stone pillars being constructed to support the wrought-iron perimeter fence. Through a donation of \$3,000 a commemorative plaque will be inlaid within a stone pillar to forever recognize your contribution towards this project.

To date, 19 pillars have been purchased leaving the remaining 7 available. If you have been thinking about providing a donation to this project please don't delay, the last available pillars are available on a first come basis.

News from the Hall

Well October is here and it is Fire Prevention Week again. The theme this year is **"Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention."** This is a fitting theme as a vast majority of home fires and burns happen in the kitchen. These types of incidents often start when a stove is left unattended while it is working. Fires can start if there is too much clutter around the stove top or on the counter beside it. Towels, recipe books, paper towel etc. should never be left near a stove top, even when it is not being used. Someone could accidentally bump a switch and then the heat is on!! Always turn handles on pots and pans inwards so they are not tempting young ones to reach up and pull on them. **"Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention."**

Call wise we have responded to an average amount of calls so far this year. We are usually fairly evenly split between accidents and fires but this year the 46% of our calls this year are fires and only 8% have been MVAs. The last 46% is split evenly between false alarms and other miscellaneous calls.

One particularly memorable call came in during the August long weekend. Our annual Bunnock Championship was in full swing and I was about to walk onto the Bones Courts and someone pointed at a bunch of black smoke. "That doesn't look good!" they said and it was off to the hall. I was just about there before my pager went off. It was a semi truck that was fully engulfed in fire just a block north of the hall. Everything went very well when we got on scene and our compressed air foam unit worked very well. The fire was extinguished very quickly. We

returned back to the hall, cleaned up all our hoses and filled the trucks with water as we always do so we are ready for the next call. Back to the tournament and I only missed three games. That is how it goes some days when you are a volunteer firefighter!

Training wise this year other than the usual regular practices, 5 members attended a weekend ICS200 course in Kindersley. This is a course that teaches you how to work together when there is multiple EMS teams at the same incident. Thank you Kindersley Fire for hosting this weekend. We also did some live fire training with the Provost Fire Department on their training ground. Live fire training is always very valuable and our rookies (and everyone else there) really learned a lot that night. Thank you Provost for hosting that evening.

Membership wise we actually upped our numbers this year. First we had Therin Doetzel leave as he accepted a new job and had to move out of town. Theo's quiet but efficient work will be missed on fire calls and at our meetings. Good Luck Therin. Thank you for your many years of dedicated service!!

Now the good news! In the past year we have had 4 new members join our Department. Welcome Amy Deck, Kaden Wappel, Keifer Cosh, and Kendra Klinger. All of them have been with us for most of the year and they have been very good at attending meetings and practices. They all say they are glad they joined and that they have learned a lot in the past year. It is a pretty steep learning curve and they have all done a great job. Their youthful energy is a great addition to our hall and Department. Welcome aboard and thank you four!! We are very glad to have you all!!

That is a very quick summary of our last year at the hall. Thank you to all our members and the fireboard for another very satisfying and rewarding year!! Be safe all and have a great fall!!
