Suffern Lake Regional Park (SLRP) is located from Macklin, Hwy #17 N 16 Km, Municipal Road #787 E 4.9 Km, Municipal Road N 16.2 Km, Rural Road W (Park Entrance). SLRP is situated on crown land in the Manitou Sandhills Integrated Resources Management Plan, an environmentally sensitive area. There are 37 serviced campsites and 10 non serviced campsites. Training wise, we are looking forward to doing our grain bin rescue course this month. We have had some very generous donations already to help us cover the cost of this course. The fee for the course and the cost of the equipment we hope to buy to help us do these rescues is going to be around \$7000.00. Any donations are very greatly appreciated and all the money donated will go directly to covering our costs on this project. A total of 25 members can attend this course, so we will be inviting other departments from the area to send people to attend as well to help fill the class.
