**Boulevard Maintenance**

That it be the responsibility of each property owner to maintain any boulevard adjacent to their property.

This includes grass cutting and tree pruning. In the event that this is not done the Town Maintenance crew will do the maintenance but only after all the other Town property is properly maintained.

Grass Clippings and Compost

It is the responsibility of each property owner to dispose of any grass clippings or compost material. There is an area designated for this at the waste transfer station where compost materials may be emptied from their bags and deposited at no charge. It is **not** an acceptable practice to place compost or grass clippings along the back alley or lane adjacent to your property.

Recreational Vehicles

It is unlawful to park any camper, boat trailer or any other trailer unit on any street or lane in town for a period longer than twenty-four (24) hours when connected or disconnected from the towing vehicle. Under special permit, this time frame may be extended to a maximum of forty-eight (48) hours. Please call the town office should you require a 24-hour extension. It is also against Town bylaws to park any vehicle on any public park or boulevard within Town limits at any time. Those individuals having campers and vehicles on any public park or boulevard within Town limits at any time. Those individuals having campers and vehicles that will fall under the provisions of this bylaw should take the necessary steps as no further notice will be given before bylaw tickets are issued.

**ATV Vehicles**

The use of All Terrain Vehicles is covered under legislation passed by the Province of Saskatchewan and violations of this act are enforced by the local RCMP. Persons owning and operating any quad, motor bike or other ATV should know what is permitted under this piece of legislation. Please contact any member of the RCMP by calling 753-2171 to discuss your rights as a property owner or ATV owner.

Complaints under the All-Terrain Vehicles Act should be directed to the RCMP. As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.

- Monday morning walk in clinics are for medical emergencies, illness, and injuries that surfaced over the weekend. Please remember chronic illness, prescription renewals, review of test results, form completion, pre ops, and ailments that are more chronic in nature ie: long term pain require a regular apt. The nurse practitioner will see as many patients as possible on a first come first serve basis from 9 – 11:30am.
- Please remember to book your prescription renewal, it is your responsibility to ensure you have enough medications until your next apt. Faxed prescription renewals are being phased out and will only be considered in extenuating circumstances
- Starting in July Dr. Erasmus will be coming to Macklin on a routine basis to get to know patients at the Villa Marie and St Joseph's long term care facility. At this time Andrea Zimmer NP will remain the only full time provider at the clinic, and Dr. Nanda will continue to serve Macklin one day per week. This is the first phase in an initiative to link care between provost and Macklin, we will notify the public as needed in the future.
- When booking appointments, please let the receptionist know if it is for a complete physical or for more than one concern so we can schedule the appropriate amount of time.
- Please remember to update your personal information including phone number and address with reception.
- The nurse practitioner is working very hard to meet the needs of all community members, including the Villa Marie and St. Joseph's Health Centre Long Term Care Patients. Please be respectful of her, her time and the clinic staff.

The coaches would like to thank the girls for a great season.

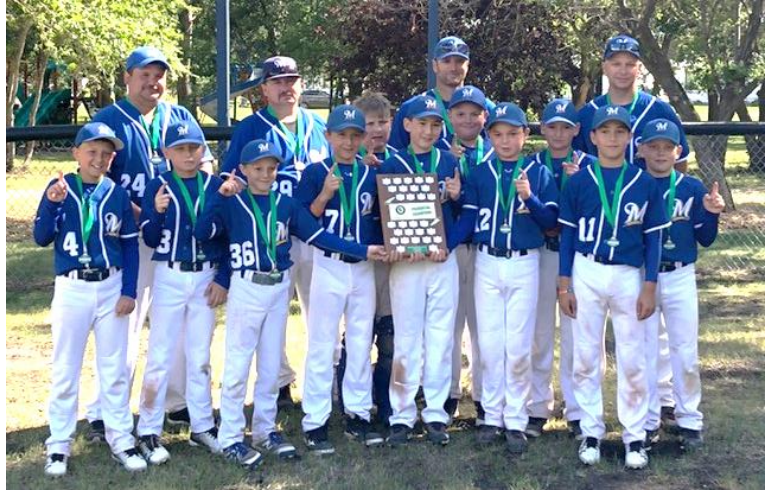
Mosquito AA Tier 6 Boys competed in Eston July 20-22. Three games were played in total. The boys worked hard and are thankful for a great year.

Macklin Mosquito Tier III Boys Win Gold!

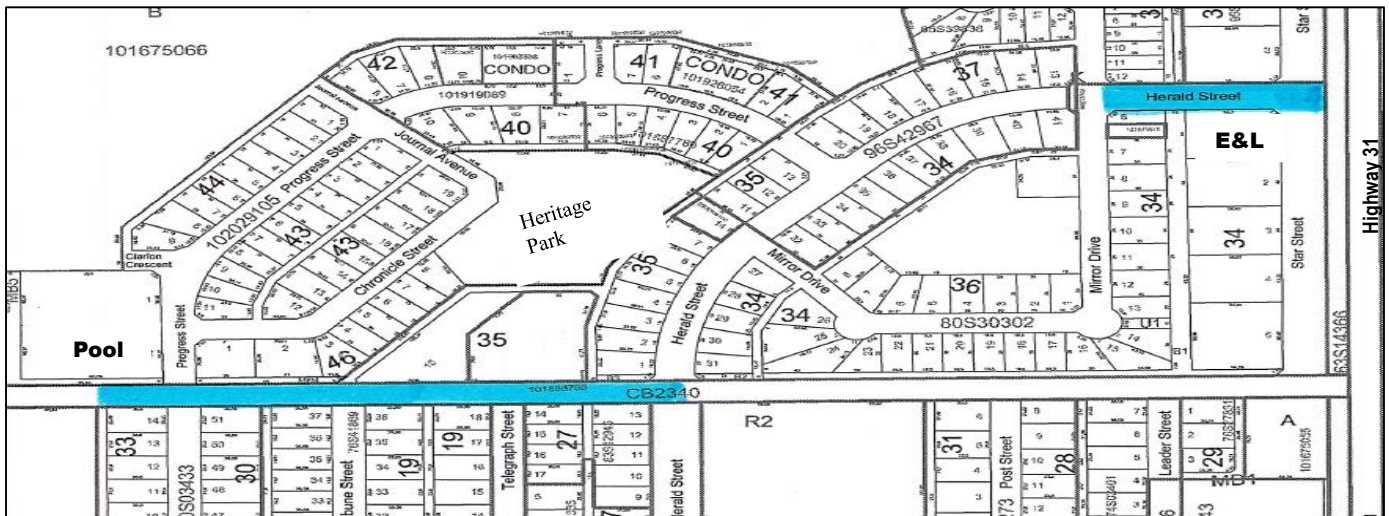

****HISTORICAL FACT****

William G. Scott (1863-1936) arrived in Macklin on June 5, 1906 with his wife and seven children ranging in age from 3 months to 16 years, 70 head of cattle and a small band of horses. Their moving van was a 10' by 16' tent atop a similar-sized wooden flat deck. They had two other wagons of household effects and farm implements. He became Macklin's first cattle rancher, first Reeve of the R.M. of Eye Hill #382(1910-13), first Mayor of Macklin (1912-17), and first Justice of Peace. He was well-known for his skill in training horses to drive by harnessing an unbroken horse with a trained horse and driving them on the weekly meat run southeast to the railway crew installing the Macklin-Moose Jaw line in 1910-11.



How Will I Know (a grandma's letter to her granddaughter)

My Dear Granddaughter: I told you the other day that I hope for you and the man you marry the kind of love that your grandfather and I had. You asked me, "How will I know when it's that kind of love?" The love I'm talking about doesn't depend on beauty or passion. It moves from physical attraction to commitment—body, mind and heart. Our marriage was not all vanilla ice cream. We both made many mistakes, many sacrifices. Your Grandfather had returned from overseas; we were just getting established in farming. Our bank account was practically non-existent but we did have a most-promising canola crop ready for harvesting. Your Grandfather was excited about starting swathing next morning. That night a devastating hail storm swept through our district. Next morning the canola field looked like a roughly mown field—the canola was razed to the ground. I was heart-broken. Your Grandfather put his arm around me, "there is always next year, dear." He was a carpenter as well as a farmer. He built our home with his own hands. It still stands today. He and I prayed every morning. Your Grandfather wasn't really the romantic sort but he did bring me flowers—sometimes wrapped in a kleenex. Once he arranged a bouquet in a vase on our wedding anniversary a few weeks before alzheimers took over his life. This is love. He helped me around the house if company was coming—not because dust on the furniture ever bothered him but because he knew I cared. He wasn't a dog lover but he let me have Ruff-dog. When I'd go on about how wonderful Ruff-dog was, always running to meet me, he'd say he'd run to meet me too if all he had to do was to lie on the front steps all day. He held me close when I cried the day Ruff-dog died. This is love. Love is not always glamorous, but it will help you get to the bathroom when you're sick.
