Commemorative Benches available at Lakeview Cemetery

Macklin Lakeview Cemetery is developing a Columbarium section. Included with the design is the installation of 5 granite benches that will be permanently installed for use by visitors. These granite benches have been constructed to allow for memorial plaques to be permanently attached.

The Lakeview Cemetery Committee wishes to make these memorial benches available to families wishing to have a long-lasting commemoration for their loved ones. There will only be five of these benches, so the committee has decided to make them available for purchase proposals on a limited time basis. If more applications for purchase are received than the available benches a lottery selection will be used to determine the approved proposals.

Each commemorative bench is valued at \$1,000.00 which includes installation and a bronze dedication plaque. The bronze plaque is 3' x 18' and can accommodate three lines of text. To submit a purchase proposal please forward an expression of interest to:

Recreational Vehicles

It is unlawful to park any camper, boat trailer or any other trailer unit on any street or lane in town for a period longer than twenty-four (24) hours when connected or disconnected from the towing vehicle. However, that in the case of a recreation type vehicle or trailer, out of town guest privileges may be granted by the Town Administrator for an extended period of time not exceeding forty-eight(48) hours. It is also against Town bylaws to park any vehicle on any public park or boulevard within Town limits at any time. Those individuals having campers and vehicles that will fall under the provisions of this bylaw should take the necessary steps as no further notice will be given before bylaw tickets are issued.

*NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.

*Traffic Tickets will be placed on unit in violation!

ATV Vehicles

The use of All Terrain Vehicles is covered under legislation passed by the Province of Saskatchewan and violations of this act are enforced by the local RCMP. Persons owning and operating any quad, motor bike or other ATV should know what is permitted under this piece of legislation. Please contact any member of the RCMP by calling 753-2171 to discuss your rights as a property owner or ATV owner. Complaints under the All-Terrain Vehicles Act should be directed to the RCMP. As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.

Property Nuisance Bylaw

The Town of Macklin has a bylaw that provides authority to regulate and enforce the care and maintenance of your private yard. If your property is adversely affecting the health or safety of your neighborhood or is interfering with your neighbor's enjoyment of their property you may be in contravention of this bylaw. Annually the bylaw section dealing with overgrown grass and weeds as well as general yard maintenance is a large source of complaints to the town office. It is your responsibility to ensure your property is neatly cared for; this includes the boulevard adjacent to your property. Grass and weeds should be maintained regularly, and trees/hedges should not be overhanging the sidewalks.

The Town of Macklin has the authority to inspect your property, deem it to be untidy and order you to remedy all items listed in a written order. Should the items listed in the order not be corrected in the time provided, seven days, the Town of Macklin will hire a contractor to complete the work required. All fees and charges associated with the ordered work will be invoiced back to you the property owner; if this invoice remains unpaid it will be added to and be collected with your annual property tax invoice.


For the benefit of the whole community take care of your property; it will allow everyone to enjoy a clean and safe community environment. The enforcement provisions outlined in the Nuisance Bylaw are there to promote community pride and are considered discretionary enforcement tools for compliance. U16 Girls are Provincial Champs!!

The Macklin U16 Bantam Girls had a short but successful season. In June, we had entered into Provincials in the Division C which was to be held in Redvers. Approximately 2 weeks before the Provincial weekend, we received notice from Sask Softball stating that Yorkton had pulled out of Provincials, leaving only 3 teams remaining; Macklin, Kindersley & Redvers. It was decided that we would not be making the 7.5 hour trek to Redvers for a 3 team draw, so with Sask Softball's approval, we would now be entered in Division B. Provincials were now in Regina and the scramble was on to change accommodations and plans but we were up for the challenge, as it meant we would be in a 16 team draw. With only playing 18 regular season games against Provost, Unity, Kindersley and Lloydminster, we were looking forward to playing other teams and going head to head with city teams in a higher caliber division.

Provincial weekend started on Friday, July 5th with our first game against a combined Warman/Martensville team. After 4 innings, we mercied them 10-0 for the win. Our second game was on Saturday against Humboldt. They were a competitive team, but we played with one goal in mind...to win the game, as only the top 2 teams out of each pool were advancing to playoffs. We took the lead and ended up ahead enough that Humboldt couldn't come back and chalked up the win with a score of 15-7. Mid afternoon the skies of Regina opened up and it down-poured, leaving an inch of water on the diamonds, so all games were cancelled for the rest of the day. Sunday meant a very early start at the diamond at 7:00 am to finish our round robin pool. We played a nearly flawless game against Regina Thunder and sealed the deal with a score of 8-1. We were now off to the quarter final against White Butte. The girls' bats were alive and with a score of 8-2 for us, the game was called after 4 innings. As the day heated up with 30+ degree temperatures and high humidity, the girls were also on fire! We met our toughest competition of the weekend, the Regina Royal Rebels. We dug ourselves quite a hole at the beginning of the game, being down 4-0 after 2 innings. The riders were a boisterous, rough-looking lot, loud and profane. I had a moment of uneasiness. Except for one attendant at the station, no one else was in sight. However, it seemed this bunch only wanted gas. While the attendant took care of that, they had drinks and munched candy bars from coin-operated dispensers. One of the riders, younger than the others, looked not much more than 16 underneath the unkempt hair. But he was the loudest and most vulgar as if to prove himself the toughest of the gang.

I wondered what a boy this young was doing with a motorcycle gang. At that moment he glanced toward me, then quickly away, as if suddenly aware of his crudeness. He leaned against the service-station wall; slowly he looked around at the few business buildings nearby, at the neat homes of this little prairie town; at the surrounding fields some ripening for an early harvest—at a farmer on a tractor; he seemed lost in memory as he watched the farmer.

When all the motorcycles had been serviced the owners wheeled off. All but one. The boy had rolled his machine away from the others and seemed to be having trouble with the starter. After a few minutes one of the bikers circled back. "Trouble, kid?" he called.

Without looking up, "Go on. I'll catch up."

He didn't move until the others were well out of sight. Then the boy's shoulders sagged as if terribly weary. Dust and grease and sweat stained his shirt and jeans. A beginning beard shadowed his chin and cheeks. He turned and briefly our eyes met. His lips twitched as if to smile but he didn't, instead he reached into the saddlebag on his bike, pulled out a wad of clothes and headed into the laundry. I stepped aside to let him pass. He tossed the bundle into an empty machine and slipped a coin into the slot. Going back outside, he cleaned and polished his bike, going inside only to transfer his wet clothes to a dryer. When the clothes were dry he took them and went into the men's room at the service station.

Ten minutes later he came out wearing the freshly washed clothes, his face clean, whiskers gone, hair combed. Grinning in my direction, he waved, jumped on his bike and zoomed up the highway. But he didn't follow the others — he headed in the opposite direction.
