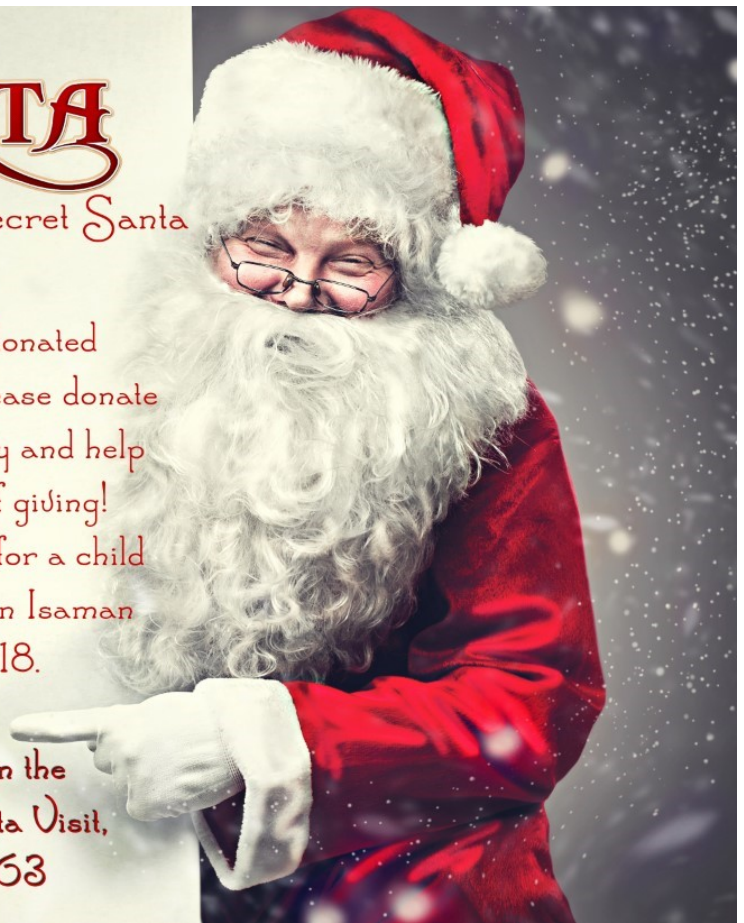

#### Public Notice – Zoning Bylaw Amendment

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Town of Macklin intends to adopt a bylaw under *The Planning and Development Act, 2007* to amend Bylaw No. 03/14, known as the Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT The proposed bylaw will:

- a) Establish the zoning districts where shipping containers may be located for storage purposes (District C2 and IND).
- b) Establish the permit application process for the location of a shipping container.
- c) Establish the rules and regulations under which a shipping container application will be approved.

AFFECTED LAND All lands within the Town boundaries zoned C2 and IND will be affected by the proposed bylaw.

REASON The proposed bylaw would provide the framework whereby an application to locate a shipping container will be considered for either temporary or permanent storage use.

PUBLIC INSPECTION Any person may inspect the bylaw at the Town of Macklin office - (5001 Press Avenue), between 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday - Friday, excluding statutory holidays. Copies are available at cost.

PUBLIC HEARING Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, December 30, 2019 at 8:00 pm in the Town of Macklin Council Chambers - 5001 Press Avenue to hear any person or group who wishes to comment on the proposed bylaw. Council will also consider written comments received at the hearing or delivered to the Town office to the undersigned prior to the hearing.



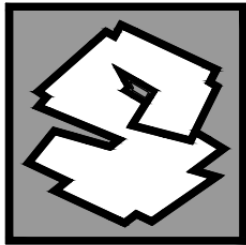

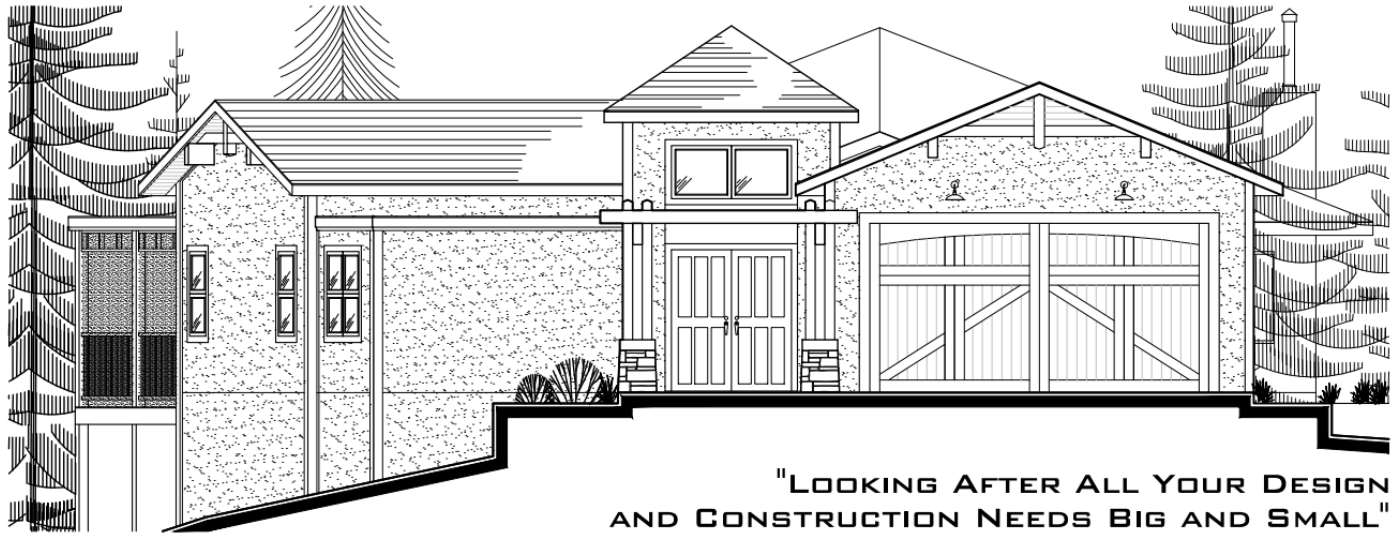

The Macklin school senior girl's volleyball team has had a very successful year. The girls were in Nipawin (Sept 6/7), Rosetown (Sept 13/14), Maidstone (Sept 19/21), Davidson (Sept 27/28), North Battleford (Oct 4/5), Meadow Lake (Oct 18/19), Macklin (Oct 25/26), Conference playoffs (Wilkie – Nov 1/2), Regionals (Macklin – Nov 8/9) and Provincials (Foam Lake – Nov 14/15/16). The girls won every tournament except the Meadow Lake tournament where they won bronze. The girls lost six sets all year and only three matches (two to Meadow Lake and one to Nipawin at the first tournament). The team went undefeated throughout the playoffs to capture the provincial 2A title. The 2A category has the most teams with 84 schools, all vying for the covenant title of champion. - There were also three traffic complaints.

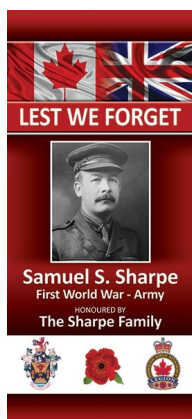
