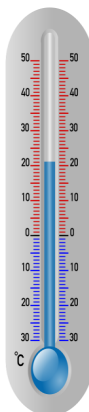

COLD WEATHER SAFETY TIPS

- Protect your pipes! If pipes run through cabinets, open the doors to let warmer room temperature flow in. If your pipes are outdoors, cover or wrap them with insulation or heat tape. (make sure heat tape is working)
- The Town of Macklin is responsible for water/sewer mainlines and Property owners are responsible for service lines connected to the Town's mainline.
- Keep water moving or let drip to prevent pipes from freezing. Make sure you know how to shut off water valves in case pipes burst.
- Understand how your furnace is vented to the outside and make sure there is no snow or ice build-up preventing the exit of exhaust.
- Make sure your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide monitors are working.
- If using a space heater, place it on a level, hard surface and keep flammable items at least 3' away. Turn off heaters before leaving or going to bed.
- Never use a stove or oven to heat your home. Check and restock your emergency preparedness kit. Make one if you do not have one.

Robert Fulghum, who wrote "All I really need to know I learned in kindergarten", is also the author of "My Secret Valentine":—

It sits on a shelf at the top of my closet. Once it was a shoe box decorated for Valentine's Day and given to me by one of my children. Its components are standard: three colours of construction paper, pink, red and white, faded now. Also there are aluminum foil, several paper doilies, macaroni, gumdrops, jelly beans, and some little white hearts with words on them (the kind that taste like Tums) and the whole thing held together with white library paste.

This shoe-box Valentine is shrivelled and mouldy now where the jelly beans and gumdrops have run together. It's sticky in places, but it holds many childhood memories given to me by my children. If you lift the lid, you will know what makes me keep it. On faded and fragile pieces of large-lined school paper are the words, "Hi, daddi" and "hoppy valimitime" and "I lov you". Glued to the bottom of the box are many X's and O's made of macaroni, each touched with daubs of red or pink or yellow. Scrawled in several places are the names of three children. It's the product of love in its simplest, most trustworthy state.

The children are grown now. They still love me, though it's harder sometimes to get direct evidence. And it's love that is complicated by age and knowledge. Love, to be sure. But it's not simple. It's not something you could put in a shoe box.

No one else knows the sticky old valentine is there. Once in a while I take it down and open it. It is something I can touch and hold and believe in, now that there are no small arms around my neck. It is my treasure chest. And it stands for love.

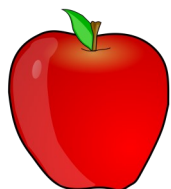
Bury it with me. I want to take it along as far as I go.

Now a more personal thought:

Love is the theme of St. Valentine's Day. I am quite devoted to St. Valentine because he gives us another opportunity to spread a bit of kindness and love. Years ago valentines were homemade and the children and I had the greatest of times with coloured paper, crayons, pieces of lace from the sewing box, and cut-out flowers from old greeting cards. I've never grown out of being a sentimentalist — and I'm not sorry in the least.

Those were some of the best of family times. The happiest families are those who give of their hands and their hearts. They do not always run to the store to buy gifts. Instead they say, "I made it specially for you" or "We thought of you today when Mom was baking cookies". They give of themselves.

And there are those who simply say as I do now, "Happy Valentines Day! God Bless you!" - and there's no lovelier gift.
