## **Grass Clippings and Compost**

It is the responsibility of each property owner to dispose of any grass clippings or compost material. There is an area designated for this at the waste transfer station where compost materials may be emptied from their bags and deposited at no charge. It is **not** an acceptable practice to place compost or grass clippings along the back alley or lane adjacent to your property.

## **Recreational Vehicles**



It is unlawful to park any camper, boat trailer or any other trailer unit on any street or lane in town for a period longer than twenty-four (24) hours when connected or disconnected from the towing vehicle. Under special permit this time frame may be extended to a maximum of forty-eight (48) hours. It is also against Town bylaws to park any vehicle on any public park or boulevard within Town limits at any time. Those individuals having campers and vehicles on any public park or boulevard within Town limits at any time. Those individuals having campers and vehicles that will fall under the provisions of this bylaw should take the necessary steps as no further notice will be given before bylaw tickets are issued.


## ATV Vehicles

As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.





#### **REMINDER:**

- Monday morning walk in clinics are for medical emergencies, illness, and injuries that surfaced over the weekend. Please remember chronic illness, prescription renewals, review of test results, form completion, pre ops, and ailments that are more chronic in nature ie: long term pain require a regular apt. The nurse practitioner will see as many patients as possible on a first come first serve basis from 9 – 11:30am.
- Please remember to book your prescription renewal, it is your responsibility to ensure you have enough medications until your next apt. Faxed prescription renewals are being phased out and will only be considered in extenuating circumstances
- Starting in July Dr. Erasmus will be coming to Macklin on a routine basis to get to know patients at the Villa Marie and St Joseph's long term care facility. At this time Andrea Zimmer NP will remain the only full time provider at the clinic, and Dr. Nanda will continue to serve Macklin one day per week. This is the first phase in an initiative to link care between provost and Macklin, we will notify the public as needed in the future.
- When booking appointments, please let the receptionist know if it is for a complete physical or for more than one concern so we can schedule the appropriate amount of time.
- Please remember to update your personal information including phone number and address with reception.
- The nurse practitioner is working very hard to meet the needs of all community members, including the Villa Marie and St. Joseph's Health Centre Long Term Care Patients. Please be respectful of her, her time and the clinic staff.



#### **Optometric Mission Trip to Colombia**

In early May, I travelled to Colombia to volunteer on an optometric mission trip. During my trip, myself and 12 other optometry students from Southern College of Optometry (SCO) provided eye exams to underprivileged people in the city of Cartagena. The exams provided the patient with a glasses prescription, exam of the health of the eye, referrals for surgery if needed and donated ocular medication and glasses if prescribed. Our group was a part of a club from our school called Student Volunteers in Optometric Service to Humanity (SVOSH), which has been organizing trips like these since 1975. This year, the club organized 5 different trips to various Central American countries and was able to serve approximately 4,300 patients. On my trip alone, we saw around 1,400 patients in 4 days. It was overwhelming to see how grateful the people were for just a simple eye exam. I really enjoyed being able to work the optical station of the clinic, because you could see how appreciative and excited each person was to receive the donated glasses and sunglasses.

SVOSH and its student members could not have organized or funded this trip without the support from various different groups and organizations. In the host countries, SVOSH depends on local Lions Clubs to organize the clinic, arrange translators and make sure the people in the area know about the clinic. At home in the USA and Canada, different clubs and organizations help support this club through monetary donations, glasses, sunglasses or ocular medications. In January and February of this year, the Macklin Kinettes helped support SVOSH by making a generous monetary donation and collecting around 1,400 glasses from Macklin and surrounding area. I would like to take this time to thank the Kinettes and the community of Macklin for supporting me on this worthwhile mission trip.

The 2018 U17 Club Volleyball season was an excellent one for the Macklin Club Team. The season starting in January and ended the first weekend in May.



### \*\*HISTORICAL FACT\*\*

The game of Bunnock was first introduced to Canada by the Russian Germans. There are several versions of how the game originated. One of them is that the game was developed in the early 1800's by the Russian military. Some old timers remember stories told by their elders relating how the Russian soldiers posted in the frozen tundra of northern Siberia, found the time endless. To help pass the time they tried to play horseshoes, but all too often they found it impossible to drive the peg into the frozen ground. With a little ingenuity, or was it sheer luck or boredom, some of the Russian soldiers discovered that the ankle bones of a horse could be set up on the frozen ground and so a new game called Bunnock (Bones) was born.

June 23rd was one of the best training days the Macklin Fire Department has ever had. Involved pump operations, numerous search and rescue scenarios in non-live environments and then we were able to conduct multiple live fire drills. Members were able to watch various conditions develop within each bedroom. Invaluable information and experiences were learned by all. Thanks to all the members who came to train and a huge thanks to the Reichert's for offering this structure for our training needs.

## **Memories**

Memories! As I stood in our New Horizons Centre the other day, after an absence of months, memory slipped back to the beginning years of this Centre.

As always in any new endeavor, we needed money for the basic operational expenses. On the Board of Directors was a lady from Evesham, (Mrs.) Bea Roadhouse. Bea was a mover; her philosophy was "stop moaning, get going". Interested in quilt-making, she organized a group of women, delegated out a few essential jobs and they were off!

On October 13, 1976, Marg Smith purchased the first quilting material for \$19.62. The number of batts purchased in the next order, 12 @ 2.98, indicates there was to be no looking back; within a week, the sale of the first quilt, \$15; soon a second sale, \$35, to Mary Mawbey. This was the beginning. Bea retired from the Board in 1979 and asked that Catherine Roadhouse replace her as the Director in charge of quilting. Many interesting and beautiful designs have been used by the Quilters through the years, but the most popular has been the Lone Star. In the spring of 1982, the first Lone Star was completed. I bought it; it has been in use ever since. Often laundered, it comes out fresh and bright--quality material, quality workmanship. Revenue, for 28 years from the quilts, was \$41,100.


