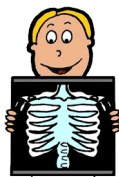

LSI and WSIT would be an asset. A minimum of two years of pool experience is preferred. This position requires a self-motivated individual to perform staff management and other duties.

Letter from the Chief

Hello All,

Last month I wrote that I had hoped that with January being over that we were through the toughest part of winter. I guess Mother Nature was saving a bit of a surprise for us. The extreme cold we have seen in February should remind of the many risks this weather brings. We went out to a call in minus 27 temperatures where a van had hit a moose 15 miles north of town. The collision shattered the windshield and the windows in both the front doors. What was a nice warm van turned very cold inside very quickly. Are you prepared for this type of event? Extra Blankets, boots, mitts and coats are very important when travelling in this type of weather. Things can change in seconds. Fortunately the people travelling in the van weren't hurt to seriously and another vehicle was right behind them and he was able to get them into his warm truck while they waited for EMS to get to the scene.

Another hazard caused by extreme cold is ice forming around chimneys and dryer vents. This can also cause carbon monoxide build up in your house. Do a quick check in the back yard and all around the house to make sure the ice isn't building up where it shouldn't.

The daylight is starting to stretch out and we should be getting to some spring temps very soon. (Hooray) Pretty soon we should be able to get out and start walking again. Dress properly and have a great February and enjoy the last blast of winter.

2018 Waste Operations Report / 2019 Fees

The Town of Macklin is committed to controlling the cost to our taxpayers and at the same time providing a dependable method of waste disposal. The WYWRA system provides a dependable and predictable system of waste disposal and recycling options. WYWRA will be introducing an Electronics collection system in conjunction with EPRA Saskatchewan. Arrangements are currently being made to have a collection bin placed at the transfer station for free disposal of electronic devices. Watch for further updates coming soon.

Are You Saved?

I'm often asked, "Where do you get your ideas for your articles?" And the answer--often from overhearing a chance remark; or from a comment in a conversation I'm having with someone; and I've always been an avid reader and there is nothing quite as broadening as 'reading' to stretch one's mind; etc., etc.. However, the basis for this month's article is a 'first', and I'll share it with you.

One day, a few years ago when I lived on the farm, there was a knock at the kitchen door. I hadn't heard or seen the approach of a car and wondered who it could be. Rather cautiously I opened the door to a total stranger--a young man, late teens, looking rather uncomfortable.

Without any preliminary, "hello" or "good day", abruptly he let me have it, -- "Are you saved?"

Rather taken aback, "Pardon me, but what did you say?"

Just as forthright, "Madam, are you saved?"

Here stood an earnest soul, no doubt, but this question from a total stranger, always irks me.

It's my personal issue, not his. And I hope this doesn't classify me as a snob; if I'm 'saved' or not, it's between God and me; I am the only one that can resolve the issue.

However, to get back to the open kitchen door and "Are you saved?"

I said, "Yes"--hoping he'd go away and leave me alone.

It is rather strange but he, and others who have met me on street corners, or wherever, and have asked me this same question, never seem to believe me for they inevitably come back, in a rather challenging tone, with "When?". "When?" I replied, "Why centuries ago, on a hill called Golgotha/Calvary and two days later on a Sabbath morning".

Giving me the strangest look, he thrust a pamphlet towards me, turned abruptly and disappeared around the corner as quietly as he had come, and was gone.

Often I have thought about this seemingly earnest inquiry from a total stranger-- 'am I saved?'

Rightly or wrongly, 'salvation' is primarily not the consequence of our choice, important as doubtless that choice is. But we are 'saved' by what God has done for us, centuries ago— Jesus on a Cross on a hill called Calvary and two days later on a Sabbath morning we now call Easter, when Jesus Christ committed His life to me, and to you, and to the world.

That is when we 'were saved'.

(Next month, April, we move into the Easter season when we wait for the Easter Sunrise.)
