

On Friday March 29th the Macklin Minor Football Association held a Sportsman Dinner featuring Guest Speakers Charleston Hughes (Saskatchewan Roughrider) followed by Brent Butt (Corner Gas & Comedian) at the Macklin Communiplex Hall. The event attracted more then 300 guests and they were certainly not disappointed in regard to the entertainment, auction items and night in general. Thanks to all our sponsors and generous bidders we were able to raise \$50,869.70 including CNRL presenting a cheque for \$7500 to be put towards our new LED Field Lights. These new lights will not only enhance our program but it will give us the ability to extend our times for practices and games given the limited amount of daylight available during the fall. This will also allow our players and opposition the unique opportunity to experience "playing under the lights". The projected cost for light fixtures, electrical cable, SaskPower service, trenching and labor to install is roughly \$58,000. The plan is to erect (6) 40' foot light poles (3 poles per side) and each pole will have (4) LED low watt light fixtures so (24) fixtures total. In the coming months residents should start seeing some changes and work being done on the football field to trench in power and put up the fixtures and poles. The committee would like to extend a huge thank you to everyone that supported

the event and look forward to our next Sportsman Charity Dinner, in a few years' time.



I hope this finds everyone happy and healthy after the long weekend. I hope you all got to spend some valuable time with family and friends!!!

We have had a quiet start to the year at the Firehall so far. (Touch wood) This is a good thing!!! The new truck has performed very well and is doing exactly what we had hoped and then some. The extra water we can carry now has saved us from calling for extra water trucks on some fires se have responded to. Recent major fires in Saskatchewan have shown us how dry this area is and how quickly small fires can get out of control. The last fire we were dispatched to we were told it was a very small fire that was just about out. 3 minutes later as we were driving to the scene we could see heavy black smoke and we knew where we were going and that it was no longer a small fire!! The people who saw the fire called 911 first and then tried to put it out themselves. They said it was just about out and then a small breeze came up and it got out of control very quickly. Thank you to them for stopping and to the neighbors who came with tractors to move dirt and help get the fire under control.

Macklin & District Fire Rescue is recommending no open fires now until we get some much needed rain and things begin to green up out there. Be safe out there all!!!

Dr. Eid Memorial Scholarship

Dr. Eid was a pioneering doctor in Macklin, who served this community for many years. After his death a scholarship fund was set up to help young people from the Macklin area who were hoping to enter a profession in the medical field. There are now 3 scholarship categories available with the Dr. Eid Memorial Scholarship. All three scholarships are one-time lump sum payments.

1. Grade 12 Scholarship

A scholarship of up to \$3000 will be awarded to a student directly entering a medical related program right after high school. This could include, but is not limited to: Nursing, Paramedic, Lab Tech, Dental Hygienist, etc.

2. Continuing Education Scholarship

A scholarship of up to \$3000 will be awarded to a student who has needed to complete prerequisite education before entering into a medical field and has now been accepted into their medical related college. This could include, but is not limited to: Medical Doctor, Pharmacist, Dentist, Physio Therapist, Nursing etc.

3. Mature Student Scholarship

A scholarship of up to \$3000 will be awarded to a student who has been out of high school for at least one year, and is now entering a medical related field of study.

To apply for these scholarships include the following:

- A cover letter explaining what field you have chosen to study and the length of the program. Why you believe you are suited for that career, and where and when you have attended high school and the principal and vice principal at the time you graduated.
- A transcript of marks, either high school or post secondary, whichever is more recent.
- A copy of your letter of acceptance or conditional acceptance from the institution you are applying to.
- Please send applications by May 17, 2019

Candidates can only receive one of these scholarships.




MACKLIN RAGE VOLLEYBALL WIN PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP


