Macklin Medical Clinic Enhanced COVID-19 Prevention

Due to the ongoing pandemic of COVID-19 virus, we are taking a proactive approach at the Macklin Medical Clinic, and therefore, we would like to make you aware of the following changes to our services at the clinic.

- When calling for an appointment, you will be asked for additional information pertaining to your current health status, travel history, and reason for an appt.
- People with current & future appointments may be offered an appointment with our nurse practitioner via telephone where appropriate. The appointment will be triaged by our nurse practitioner/clinic staff, and an appointment time via telephone or clinic visit will be provided.
- Monday morning walk-in clinic will be temporarily discontinued.
- For up to date information regarding COVID-19 please use www.saskatchewan.ca/COVID-19

Our clinic will be staffed during our regular business hours. If you are experiencing symptoms such as cough, fever, or shortness of breath, we ask that you **do not visit the clinic**, your options include:

- Call Healthline 811 for assessment and direction.
- Use the self assessment tool available at www.saskatchewan.ca/COVID-19
- Call Macklin clinic at 306 753 2366

If you have travelled **out of province or internationally**, self-isolation is required for 14 days after returning from travel.

DO NOT VISIT any long term care or assisted living facilities without first speaking to the facility director by telephone.

These changes to our service.es are an effort to avoid a gathering of people in our waiting room and any unnecessary contact, which we hope will result in the slowing/stopping of the COVID-19 virus.

RCMP Macklin Report

March 24—April 20

- RCMP received a report of an abandoned vehicle by the cemetery. Members contacted the registered owner who agreed to move the vehicle.
- An individual located two small baggies on the street. Both baggies had a small amount of powder inside. The substance tested positive for cocaine. There was insufficient evidence to proceed.
- Police received a complaint of a break and enter into outbuildings in a rural farmyard near Macklin. This matter is still
 under investigation.
- Members are investigating a complaint of impaired operation of a motor vehicle.
- RCMP received a complaint of a vehicle damaging a gate at the cemetery. This matter is still under investigation.
- Police received a Mental Health Act complaint. Members spoke with the subject of complaint.
- Members are investigating a complaint of an individual damaging a vehicle.
- RCMP received a complaint of an individual failing to comply with a condition of a recognizance. This matter is still under investigation.
- Members assisted an individual by offering transportation to a vehicle after the individual had obtained fuel for the vehicle.
- Police received a complaint of an individual knocking on the windows of a residence. Members attended but could not locate a subject of complaint.
- RCMP received a Mental Health Act complaint. Members spoke to the subject of complaint who was left in the care of a family member.
- Members conducted a wellbeing check at the request of a family member.
- Police received a report of gunshots heard near Primate. Members located the subject of complaint who was shooting skeet on private property with a valid Possession and Acquisition Licence. No police action required.
- RCMP received a report of a single vehicle collision with a deer on Highway 17 north of Macklin. There were no injuries. Reported for insurance purposes.
- There was also one traffic complaint.

RCMP Statistics for Macklin and Area

As we were unable to hold the Community wide RCMP meeting due to COVID-19, this report has been supplied along with the previous years data for comparison.

Persons Crimes:

You will note that there has been an overall increase in work-load for the members. This was not unexpected given the down-turn in the economy. Unity detachment had observed an increase in the overall number of Assaults, and Assault with Weapons investigations the members have been dealing with. There have been 2 reported robberies during this period; but arrests have been made in both instances and the matters are still currently under investigation with charges laid in 1 robbery already.

Property Crimes:

There has been a minor decrease in the number of Break and Enters reported in Unity and Wilkie, with increases in some RM's and reductions in others.

Theft of vehicle crimes have more than doubled over last year. <u>In most cases, if not all, the keys (spare keys, or keys left in the ignition or console area) were left inside the vehicle.</u> There has also been an increase in thefts from motor vehicles, so leaving items in unattended vehicles increases the risk of theft.

Financial Crimes:

There is also an increase in the number of reported frauds both under and over \$5,000. This is often through computer or phone scams.

Road Safety:

The number of fatal collisions remain the same at 1, the number of injury collisions has been reduced, but there has been an increase in the number of collisions involving property damage. There has also been an increase in the number of tickets issued for unsafe driving practices, and an increase in the number of Impaired Drivers arrested and charged this past year.

Mental Health and Well-being checks:

Both have seen a increase this past year.



Dr. Eid Memorial Scholarship

Dr. Eid was a pioneering doctor in Macklin, who served this community for many years. After his death a scholarship fund was set up to help young people from the Macklin area who were hoping to enter a profession in the medical field. There are now 3 entry level scholarship categories available with the Dr. Eid Memorial Scholarship. All three scholarships are one-time lump sum payments.

Grade 12 Scholarship

A scholarship of up to \$3000 will be awarded to a student directly entering a medical related program right after high school. This could include, but is not limited to: Nursing, Paramedic, Lab Tech, Dental Hygienist, etc.

2. Continuing Education Scholarship

A scholarship of up to \$3000 will be awarded to a student who has needed to complete prerequisite education before entering into a medical field and has now been accepted into their medical related college. This could include, but is not limited to: Medical Doctor, Pharmacist, Dentist, Physio Therapist, Nursing etc.

3. Mature Student Scholarship

"What's that noise? — a tap, tap, tapping!

6 a.m. I went downstairs to check . "Well, Robin, good morning! All decked out in your soft-red vest and charcoal jacket. Still up to your old tricks, I hear?"

There he was, whacking against the corner window pane with the greatest fury. Old Maple is Robin's nesting place, and each year I've watched him do battle with his reflection in the glass as he fights off this elusive threat to his nesting claim. The first year he fought to exhaustion before I realized all I had to do was draw the drapes and stop the mirror-action of the glass. I drew the drapes. It's one of Robin's initial rites of territorial claim soon to be supplanted by the urgency of courtship. Birds delight me, fill me with a sense of awe. How does Robin migrate? How does he find his way?—all those miles from his winter home in south-central United States to his summer home in Old Maple here on the farm. Always arriving within the same span of seven days my bird-book records confirm. How does he know for sure when to pack his bags and lift off? Ornithologists suggest it is the angle of the sun's rays and a specific hour reached in the extending hours of daylight that triggers the moment of departure; airborne and off with thousands of fellow travellers, all male; the females follow shortly. All flowing in great clouds of thrumming wings up the Mississippi flyway. They move with the pulse of coming spring, averaging about 30 miles a day, feeding as they moved north. But as the pulse of spring speeds up so does the flight, flying faster and faster as they neared their particular homeland covering perhaps 150 miles a day often at a comparatively low few hundred feet above cities, towns and countryside, past hawks and owls, on they came, mile after mile over valleys, hills and lakes, each a landmark. Suddenly a landmark said 'home'.

Robin dropped out of the migration.

Old Maple, imprinted on his 'bird brain' beckoned. "Cheerily-up" he called from the moment he arrived in the topmost branch. A special thrill, no other spring surprise can quite match it. Robin was back! He confirmed Spring, new life, renewed hope.

Busy days as songs cascaded across the farmyard; he and friends busily staking out nesting claims. Mss. Robins soon arrived. Then evenings rippled with the torrent of song as courtships followed; homes established.

Next morning I watched him running and hopping across the lawn. Head cocked to the side, listening, listening, for a faint rustling underground. Then sudden sharp beak stab. His famous feat, a feat no other bird can duplicate with such finesse. Robin leaned back and pulled and pulled, pulled forth, not a piece, but one long whole juicy earthworm! '
