It happened on Main Street on an evening when the world went hilariously crazy. We all remember the day, the end of WW11. I didn't see this thing happen, —my friend Tom told me about it. It began on Main St. as thousands of people milled around, shouting, singing, dancing.

Tom was standing watching the crazy crowd when he saw it—boy meeting girl; a lonely young airman in a strange city, three RCAF ribbons on his uniform; the girl, pretty in a flowered dress, hat and gloves. They met, passed, stopped, turned, looked at each other, smiled, he said something; the girl said something and started to move on, hesitated, turned back, he touched her arm, said something. She let him take her hand. One last flash of the ribbons on his jacket, one last ripple of her dress, the tap of her high heels and they were gone together, lost from sight in the jubilant crowd —typical pickup.

And, thought Tom, they would find the relief from loneliness they were looking for. They would go into a bar, have a drink or two, go into some crowded restaurant for something to eat.

Tom said he thought of them again later in the evening, thought of them in the hesitant, youthful rapture these hours would bring, their voices lower, more intimate now over their coffee, then walking hand-in-hand along streets where people laughed in celebration, eventually riding up in the elevator to the room where he stayed, there they would snuggle together as young people do in times of peace, but more readily, more urgently when the guns are still echoing in their ears.

There would be the pleading, the denial, finally the consenting—a passion so overwhelming at the moment. Next morning, they would part each going their own way— later to be filled with regrets, remorse. That is how Tom thought it would be with them as he walked on among the crowd; thinking all the heartbreaks of war are not on the battlefields—there are the broken promises to loved ones waiting at home. After an hour or so, Tom found himself near St. Paul's Cathedral. He climbed the steps. Within, all was quiet; people at prayer. He turned to look back at the screaming throngs on Main Street.

It was then that he saw them again. Saw them step out from the crowd—the airman with the ribbons, the girl with the high heels. They stopped, looked at each other; then made their way up the steps into St Paul's Cathedral, got down on they knees, side by side.

And Tom saw them praying there together.

Multi-year Street Improvement Plan Approved

The following is a condensed version of the report issued from the August 21, 2018 public meeting hosted by the Saskatchewan Municipal Board Local Government Committee. A copy of the complete nine-page report can be found on the Town of Macklin website www.macklin.ca

The Town of Macklin applied to the Saskatchewan Municipal Board for approval to complete a multi-year street pavement project. The project proposed included the installation, renewal or replacement of pavement and sidewalk and/or curb and gutter in various areas of town. The towns application was submitted under subsection 5(1) (c) of The Local Improvements Act, 1993 whereby specially assessed property owners do not have the right to petition against the project.

The Town-to-property owner ratio of the costs to be specially assessed against property owners for pavement is two-thirds Town to one-third property owner and for sidewalk is one-third Town to two-thirds property owner. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$6,181,419 with the Town of Macklin's share \$4,151,703 and Property Owner's share \$2,029,716. The estimated special assessment rates proposed by the Town to be levied are based on the number of lineal metres of frontage of lands benefitted; Pavement \$150 per lineal metre of frontage and for sidewalk \$115 per lineal metre of frontage.

The Committee found that the Town's local improvement proposal is equitable within the framework of the Act and the costs are proposed to be shared equally among the properties affected. Therefore, the Committee approves the decision of Council to proceed with the multi-year local improvement project with one condition:

"The rates levied against benefiting property owners for both pavement and sidewalk projects shall remain the same throughout all years of the projects as those levied in the first year (proposed as 2018), considering the projects are not proposed to change from year to year. If necessary, additional (non-inflationary) costs are incurred beyond those forming the basis of property owner levies in the first year of the projects are eligible under section 16 of Act, such necessary, additional costs could result in increased levies in future years."
