I will update how it went in my next newsletter.

On September 24th, 3 representatives from My Mutual Insurance

They got to see 2 new AED machines that we now can carry in our trucks. They also brought a camera man who filmed us while we were training. We took their crew out to our training ground and did a mock rescue of a car accident so they got to see the new Jaw of Life in action. The Mutual Team asked if they could talk to someone who we had helped in the past. We had a community member come to the hall that night and he explained how we had helped one of his family members at a very serious car accident. His words and emotions were very, very powerful and moving. First he spoke to the camera crew and then he came up to the meeting room and spoke to us. First he asked who helped that day and about half the members in the room put up their hands. He then told us how his day went that day, from when he got the call at work, to getting to the accident scene, to getting on STARS and getting to the Saskatoon Hospital. He touched all of us very deeply and I'm sure none of us will ever forget his heartfelt words and gratitude. He told us to keep on doing what we are doing. That we shall do Sir!! That we shall do!! Thank you for your courage and support!!

Call wise, we had one small stubble fire that was brought under control very quickly and we were back at the hall in about an hour.

That's all from the hall! Hope to see you at the hall on the 11th! Otherwise be safe and check your smoke detectors.




2024 Upcoming Municipal Elections
