From the Hall

Most of you have probably seen it at one time or another. During a meal, at a hockey game or during the Bunnock Tournament. Some cell phones might ring at the same time and several people drop what they are doing and head to the fire hall. Not because they're paid to but because someone in our area needs help. For 29 years I have been proud to be one of those people. In the last four months our membership has dropped by 4, as people have moved out of the area and a sudden death of one of our members.

Volunteer firefighters are the backbone of emergency response in small towns like ours. We respond to fires, vehicle collisions, medical emergencies, grass fires (sometimes false alarms,) and more. We train hard, work as a team, and show up when people need us on some of their worst days. But like many departments, we're feeling the strain of fewer volunteers and growing demands.

The truth is, you don't need to be a superhero to be a firefighter. You don't need prior experience or training. What you do need is a willingness to learn, a commitment to training, and a desire to serve your community and surrounding area. Our department provides all the training and equipment you need, and you'll be part of a team that works very well together under all different kinds of circumstances.

Volunteering as a firefighter is challenging, but it's also incredibly rewarding. You gain skills that last a lifetime, from emergency response and first aid, to leadership and teamwork. You form strong friendships and become part of a dedicated team. And there's no feeling quite like knowing you helped protect a home, saved a life, or made a real difference for someone when it mattered most.

Our area has always taken care of one another. That's always been who we are. Just count the volunteer hours that go into our Bunnock Tournament. Becoming a volunteer firefighter is one powerful way to continue that tradition.

If you've ever thought, "I wonder if I could do that," the answer is yes, you probably can. We're looking for dedicated community members who want to step up and serve.

If you're interested in learning more, we have meetings the first and third Tuesday of every month at 7:00, talk to any member of our department, or contact Justin Bast or myself. We'd be happy to answer your questions and show you what being part of Macklin and District Fire Rescue is all about.

When we get dispatched, our department has been answering the call since 1912. With your help, we can make sure our area is always protected.

Lyle Brost entertained us during our Nashville Evening. Country music, donuts, southern iced tea punch, and western wear, what an evening to be had!






