Macklin Adult Community Drama presents "The Olympians: An Epic Muse-ical"

The Macklin Adult Community Drama, in conjunction with the Macklin Arts Council, performed "The Olympians: An Epic Muse-ical" to over 500 people on April 10, 11 and 12. In the play, three Greek goddesses: Athena (Della Stang), Aphrodite (Sheena Alberti), and Artemis (Katherine Vanhouwe), engage in a bet about how to best advance women's place in the world. They make a wager to determine which is the most powerful tool: a top-notch mind (Sophia played by Ashley Spykerman), a loving heart (Lexi played by Celine Vokins), or a fighting spirit (Zoe played by Kira Scott). The goddesses set each of the three girls on a quest to prove their point. The girls are accompanied on their journey by Xander (Jeremy Vokins). When the male god Apollo (Shane Campbell) catches wind of the mortals' plans, he uses his powers to make the quests much more treacherous than the goddesses intended. Ultimately, the mortal girls (and the goddesses) realize that it will take all three qualities to make a difference, and they understand that, rather than competing with each other, they must work together to prove that sometimes you can all be heroes.

"The Olympians" features an eclectic score of hits from Miley Cyrus, Kelly Clarkson, Blondie, The Chicks, Pat Benatar, and many more, making this tale of Ancient Greece very contemporary.

Any play is dependent on every member of the cast no matter the role and this play allowed the doubling and tripling of roles. This play would not have happened without the following members: Myrna Stang (Grandmother, Hera, Lotus Eater, ensemble) who had the most costume changes of anyone in the history of Macklin Adult Drama, Gracelyn Loehndorf (Ensemble, Lotus Eater), Perry Stang (Orpheus, Lotus Eater), Donna Burningham (Ensemble, Lotus Eater, Guard), Derra Gartner (Lotus Eater, Guard, Ensemble), Kirstin Sieben (Guard, Ensemble), Autumn Clemmer (Ensemble), Andrea Figurski (Ensemble), Don Golden (Guard, Zeus, Ensemble), Jim Kowalski (Professor, Lotus Eater, Ensemble) and Andy Scott (Diogenes, Guard, Lotus Eater, Ensemble).

This show was held together by the narrator, Thalia, played by Denise Feser who entertained the audience with the number of lines and actions that she was required to do.

The Macklin Adult Community Drama has produced over 10 musicals and once again relied on the amazing musical talents of Maureen Stang, Pat Stang, Rob Stang and Peter Sieben. We could not do this without you guys.

There are many other people who are essential to the success of "The Olympians": Kevin Burningham (Director), Erika Cook (stage manager), Emmitt Germann, Everett Germann and Talis Vokins (sound and lighting) and the Arts Council for providing us with the necessary funding and support. Thank you.

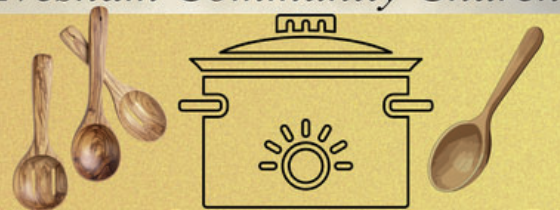

DID YOU KNOW MACKLIN HAS A NUISANCE BYLAW FOR UNKEPT YARDS?

Now that the snow has melted and spring is here, property owners should ensure their yards are tidy. The Town of Macklin Bylaw No. 12/05 known as the Nuisance Abatement Bylaw provides for the abatement of nuisances, including property, activities, or things that adversely affect:

- The safety, health or welfare of people in the neighborhood;
- People's use and enjoyment of their property; or
- The amenity of a neighborhood.

Property owners are required to:

- Regularly remove debris from their yards;
- Maintain vegetation to prevent overgrowth; (cut grass, trim trees and shrubs, etc.)
- Dispose of waste and materials;
- Ensure structures such as fences, sheds, and other outdoor installations are kept in good repair.



Property owners who do not observe the Town of Macklin Bylaw are in contravention AND WILL BE issued an Order to Remedy detailing the nature of the contravention(s) and the corrective action(s).

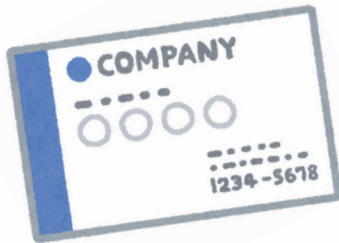

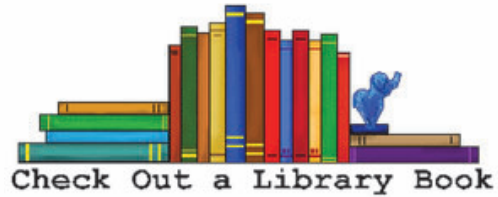
