WYWRA Recycle accepts three main recyclable materials including:

- **Cardboard - NO Pizza Boxes**
  - Make sure to flatten your cardboard and place it into your bin so that the lid is not ajar. Ensure the lid remains closed as rain and snow will cause cardboard weight to increase rapidly. Wet, heavy cardboard can cause damage to equipment.
- **Mixed Paper - NO used paper products**
  - Place shredded paper into a clear or clear blue bag; do not use a black bag, clear / blue recycle bags only please.
  - "If you can rip it, you can recycle it!"
- **Plastics #1 to #6 with a Recycle Symbol \*\***
  - Please ensure you remove all caps and lids without a recycling #1 to #6 symbol. (usually black, or dark in color)
  - **Unacceptable Plastics: black plastics, styrofoam, and plastic film (grocery bags, sandwich bags, cling-wrap, etc.).**
- **Household Aluminum and Tin**
  - For tin can lids, simply place the top back into the container and squeeze closed.
  - Paper can be left on the cans.

**Recycling Reminder:**  
*Styrofoam and "used" paper products (eg. napkins, kleenex, etc.) do NOT belong in recycling. Please place these items in regular garbage to help reduce contamination in our recycling program.*

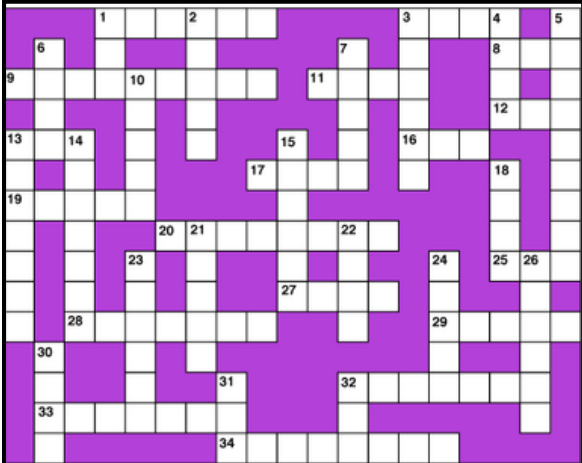

### DID YOU KNOW MACKLIN HAS A NUISANCE BYLAW FOR UNKEPT YARDS?

Now that the snow has melted and spring is here, property owners should ensure their yards are tidy. The Town of Macklin Bylaw No. 12/05 known as the Nuisance Abatement Bylaw provides for the abatement of nuisances, including property, activities, or things that adversely affect:

- The safety, health or welfare of people in the neighborhood;
- People's use and enjoyment of their property; or
- The amenity of a neighborhood.

Property owners are required to:

- Regularly remove debris from their yards;
- Maintain vegetation to prevent overgrowth; (cut grass, trim trees and shrubs, etc.)
- Dispose of waste and materials;
- Ensure structures such as fences, sheds, and other outdoor installations are kept in good repair.

Property owners who do not observe the Town of Macklin Bylaw are in contravention AND WILL BE issued an Order to Remedy detailing the nature of the contravention(s) and the corrective action(s).

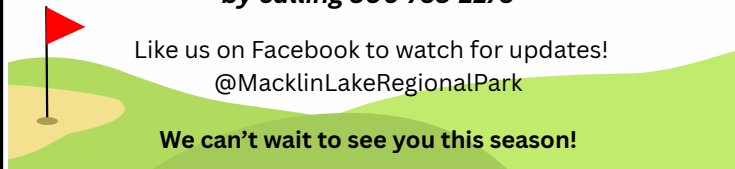

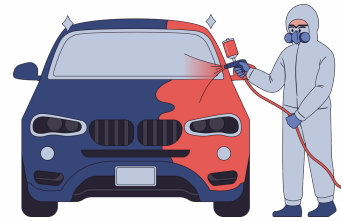

It was a lovely afternoon to have Michelle J. and her friends come out with their dogs. There were a variety of dogs which made everyone smile.

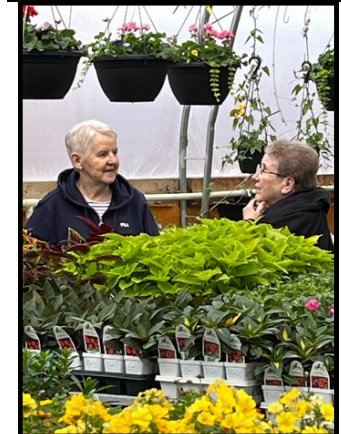

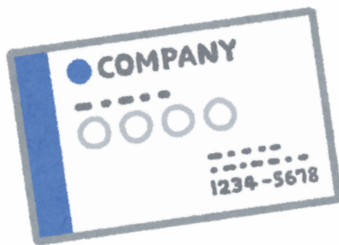

Well...I am officially a member of the early risers club. Tuesday May 5th, 2:42 A.M. Structure Fire. Back at the hall by 8:30, At work by 9:30. Wednesday May 6th, 5:53 A.M. Another structure fire. Thursday May 7th, 2:30 A.M. Oil spill on the highway. I was back home by 3.30 that night. I was one of the lucky ones. Monday May 11th, 5:21 A.M. A small structure and grass fire. I was only a little late for work that day. May 11th we were dispatched again for another grass fire that afternoon. Needless to say we have had a very busy 5 weeks. We have responded to 16 calls between April 7th and May 11th. We also had 3 regular meeting/practices during that time. I'm beginning to think the Chief is sleeping at the hall in between the calls and the paperwork that always comes with each call out. Thank you as always to our employers for letting us slip away on a moment's notice or letting us come in late when we are out most of the night. Thank you to our families for your support. I know you have trouble falling back to sleep after our pagers go off at all hours.

I know that lot's of you don't sleep soundly again until you know we are back at the hall getting the equipment ready for the next call. One of the practice nights we took our new foam trailer to Provost, and spent the evening there, making foam and training with their Department. The new unit makes tons of foam and should work very well when we need it. It is always productive to practice with our neighbors to the west. Alberta and Saskatchewan use different threads on their hoses and hydrants so the practices always help make sure we have the right thread adaptors so that we can pump water together. Provost did come to our one structure fire on a mutual aid call and it worked very well pumping from their trucks to ours. Thank you Provost Fire for you support that night. You got there just in time!!

Training wise we have been busy as well. 4 members just took the ICS 100 course. (ICS stands for Incident Command System) The course teaches members how a command system works when multiple agencies are working at the same incident. An example could be a large structure fire where multiple Fire Departments, Police and Ambulance are all on scene. There could also be road graders, backhoes and track hoes called to these scenes. The communication between all these groups is critical for doing the job as safely and quickly as possible.

We also had 4 members go to North Battleford for a weekend to take a Grassland/Wildland Fire Fighting course. Chief Justin and Deputy Chief Greg Bast also attended the Annual Fire Chief's Convention, held in Kindersley this May. They said there was lots of good information shared and there is a trade show there as well, so they could see some of the new equipment and tools that are being introduced to the industry. We had 2 members attend the school's fire drill as well. Just to observe and see how the school is doing on this. Good job students and staff. Practice makes perfect.

We have also had another member join. Welcome to the department Mek. You certainly have been baptized with fire. Don't worry, it is not always this busy. Man I love this job!!

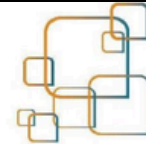
