### **News from the Hall**

Hello All from the hall.

I can't believe it but October is already here and it is time once again time for Fire Prevention Week. This year's theme is "Charge into Fire Safety: Lithium Ion Batteries in Your Home" As a firefighter, I want to take a few minutes to talk about why this matters to all of us here in town. We have already responded to two fairly serious fires caused by phone chargers.

Lithium-ion batteries are everywhere—from our phones and laptops to power tools, e-bikes, toys, and even some household appliances. They're powerful, lightweight, and reliable. But like any piece of technology, they need to be used safely. If damaged, improperly charged, or tossed into the trash, these batteries can overheat, catch fire, or even explode. We've seen the results firsthand at the fire hall, and trust me, it's something you don't want happening in your home.

Here are some simple steps to help keep you and your family safe:

### 1. Buy Smart.

Only purchase devices and batteries from reputable companies. Off-brand or counterfeit batteries may cut corners on safety. If a deal seems too good to be true, it probably is.

### 2. Charge Safely.

Use the charger that came with your device, and follow the manufacturer's instructions. Don't leave devices charging overnight or while you're away from home. Always charge on a hard, flat surface—never under a pillow, on a bed, or near anything that can catch fire.

### 3. Store Carefully.

Keep batteries at room temperature. Avoid leaving them in direct sunlight, inside a hot vehicle, or near heaters. Extreme heat can cause damage and increase fire risk.

### 4. Recycle Responsibly.

Lithium-ion batteries should never go in household garbage or recycling bins. Many hardware stores and recycling centers accept them safely. In our community, you can drop them off at a SARCAN Location or Macklin Town Office (restrictions to types collected).

### 5. Watch for Warning Signs.

If a battery is swelling, leaking, or giving off an odd odor, stop using it right away. Move it to a safe place outdoors and contact your local waste authority about how to dispose of it properly.

As firefighters, our job is to respond when emergencies happen—but our greater mission is to help prevent them in the first place. By taking these small steps, you're not just protecting your home and family, but also helping keep our whole community safe.

Let's all do our part this Fire Prevention Week. Charge into Fire Safety™, and keep lithium-ion batteries working for you—not against you.

We will be hosting the kids from the Daycare and some of the Elementary classes at the school again but that has not happened as of this writing. I will update you in a future article.

Call wise, we have been out to some field fires and have been asked to help land STARS on a couple of incidents. The Department here is trained to prepare the landing site for Stars so we are called when their services are needed in our area.

We also have had a new member coming out for the last couple of meetings and he has already been out on a few calls. Welcome to our team Mihai

That's all from the hall everyone. Reread the simple steps above and get used to not leaving chargers plugged in that aren't being used!!

Be safe and that's all from the hall.

## RCMP MACKLIN REPORT August 12 — September 15, 2025

Macklin Detachment: (306) 753—2171 Monday – Friday 8:00am – 12:00 noon

- RCMP attended the sudden death of a 66-year-old male from Macklin. The death was not suspicious in nature.
- Police initiated a traffic stop but the vehicle fled from Members.
   Members patrolled but could not locate the subject of complaint.
- Members conducted a wellbeing check at the request of a concerned citizen.

### **ONLINE CRIME REPORTING**

Unity RCMP are reminding people that Online Crime Reporting has been created for Saskatchewan residents to report crime in a way that is convenient, modern, and accessible. By redirecting certain crime types through this online platform, we can shift some of the workload away from front line personnel. **The website can be visited at:**

What types of crime can be reported online through the OCR tool and
processed by the CBU?

- Fraud & Scams: any type of fraud that is under \$5,000 (e.g. CRA scams, compromised personal identity information, internet/telephone -based frauds, etc.).
- Vandalism Damage: any type of damage to property that is under \$5,000 (e.g. Canada Post mailboxes, fence spray painted, oil field sites, etc.).
- Lost & Stolen Property: any type of stolen or lost property under \$5,000 (e.g. theft from a motor vehicle – including catalytic converters or car batteries, theft of mail, bikes, copper wire, etc.).
- ◆ Traffic Offences: traffic complaints when direction of vehicle is unknown, the licence plate unknown, or incomplete vehicle description (e.g. loud muffler, stunting/erratic driving, speeding, etc.).
- ♦ Harassing Phone Calls or ECommunication: involves social media or text messaging. \*Does not include threats of violence or sextortion.

  If the incident being reported meets the one of the above criteria but there is a witness or suspect, the public is being directed to report the crime to their local RCMP detachment.

Persons with information about crimes being committed in the Unity / Wilkie/ Macklin areas are urged to call the Unity RCMP detachment at (306)228-6300; the Wilkie RCMP at (306) 843-3480; or the Macklin RCMP at (306) 753-2171. If you wish to remain anonymous, you may also call Saskatchewan Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477, or \*8477 on the SaskTel Mobility Network. Crime Stoppers will pay up to \$2000.00 for information which leads to the arrest of person(s) responsible for any serious crime. Crime Stoppers is anonymous and does not subscribe to call display, nor are your calls traced or recorded. # **COMMUNITY HARVEST YIELDS FOODBANK SUPPORT!**

Greg Rissling has for many years restored antique farm machinery to working condition. An extension of the restoration is hosting an Old Time Harvest at his farm each Fall. On Sunday Sept. 21st he had a John Deer D tractor and a John Deer #12 combine harvesting twenty acres of wheat. The crop is grown on Gregs land with seeding and spraying provided by Kohlman Brothers Farms. A variety of tractors pulled a grain wagon to and from the yard often topped with children along for the ride. The harvest is a community event with visitors dropping in to watch, enjoy a cold pop and chips, and take a turn at harvesting some wheat. All pretty nice.

What makes it special is what happens after the people go home and the various tractors and carts and combine go back into storage. Every year the wheat from his Antique Harvest makes its way to Luseland to the Viterra grain terminal. The wheat is weighed, graded, and sold and then Viterra matches the value with a donation in the same amount. The final cheque is then handed to Greg and he donates it to food banks in Macklin, Denzil and Luseland. And so an afternoon of fun and community and work ends up
