





Did you know???



Pharmacists can prescribe for minor ailments, improving access to health care services in the community. Your Pharmacist can continue to help you with selecting the most appropriate remedy or medication and is able to provide prescriptions for some ailments:

*The pharmacist MLST conduct an assessment to determine that the case falls within their Scope of Practice for Minor Ailment

Prescribing or if referral to a physician or NP is required*

*Pharmacists may not prescribe for patients who are immunocompromised due to disease or medications for most minor ailments.

- Acne (Acne Vulgaris)- Requirements: 9 + years of age, mild acne only
 - Pharmacists may only prescribe topical products for acne
- Canker Sore (Oral Aphthous Ulcer)
- Cold Sore (Herpes Labialis)- Requirements: 12+ years of age, previous diagnosis
- Contact Dermatitis (Allergic or Irritant)
- Diaper Rash (Diaper Dermatitis: Irritant and Candidal)
- Eczema (Atopic Dermatitis)
- Erectile Dysfunction- Requirements: 18+ years old, previous diagnosis
- Folliculitis (Bacterial Folliculitis)- Requires referral: extensive area affected
- Fungal Skin Infections: Ringworm (Tinea Corporis), Jock Itch (Tinea Cruris), Athlete's Foot (Tinea Pedis)
- Genital Herpes (Herpes Simplex)- Requirements: 12+ years of age, previous diagnosis
- Headache (Tension-Type and Migraine) Requirements: age 6+
- Heartburn (Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease GERO)- Requirements: 18+ years old, previous diagnosis
- **Hemorrhoids** Requirement: 12+ years of age
- Hormonal Contraception Requirements: 12+ years old
- Impetigo (Non-Bullous Impetigo)- Requirements: 2 months old+
 - Requires referral: systemic symptoms, widespread lesions, frequent recurrences
- Insect Bites and Stings
- Menstrual Cramps (Primary Dysmenorrhea)
- Musculoskeletal Strains and Sprains (Acute) Requirements: 2+ years old
 - Requires referral: systemic symptoms, severe pain (>7 on 10-point scale), significant trauma
- Nausea and Vomiting of Pregnancy
- Nicotine Cessation- Requirements: 12+ years old
- Oral Thrush (Oral Candidiasis)- Requires referral: use of dentures, recent burn, lesions present >3 weeks
- Pink Eye (Conjunctivitis)- Requires referral: contact wearer, trauma to the eye
- Pinworms (Enterobiasis Infection)- Requirements: 2+ years of age
- Seasonal Allergies (Allergic Rhinitis)- Requirements: 2+ years old
- Shingles (Herpes Zoster) Requirements: 12 + years of age, previous diagnosis preferred
 - Requires referral: nausea/vomiting, fever, chills, severe pain, ocular involvement
- Sinus Infection (Acute Rhinosinusitis)- Requirements: 6 months old+
- Toenail Infection (Toenail Onychomycosis)- Requirements: 18+ years old, previous diagnosis
- Urinary Tract Infection (Cystitis: Acute, Uncomplicated)- Requirements: age 16+, previous diagnosis

*Continuing MaintenanceTherapy- If you are taking medications regularly, your prescription has run out and you are unable to get in to see your physician or NP for several days: most often, your pharmacist can provide the supply you need until you are able to visit your provider, and will let your provider know.

RCMP MACKLIN REPORT October 21— November 17, 2025

- RCMP received a complaint of a break and enter at Macklin Lake Regional Park but there was insufficient evidence to proceed.
- Police received a complaint of a stolen truck. The vehicle was later located burned in a rural area near Provost. Insufficient evidence to proceed.

- RCMP received a report of a two-vehicle collision near Macklin. There
 were no injuries. A traffic ticket was issued to one vehicle driver.
- Police received a Mental Health Act complaint. Members spoke to the subject of complaint.
- Members are investigating a complaint of counterfeit money used to purchase items at a local business.
- RCMP received a complaint of assault. This matter is still under investigation.

- Police located an abandoned vehicle on Highway 14 near Macklin.
- Members contacted the registered owner who agreed to move it.
- RCMP received a complaint of an individual harming a dog. This matter is still under investigation.
- Police received a Mental Health Act complaint. Members spoke to the subject of complaint.
- Members conducted a wellbeing check at the request of a concerned citizen.
- RCMP received a report of a two-vehicle collision in Macklin. There were no injuries. This matter is still under investigation.
- Members are investigating a complaint of vandalism to a residence.
- There was also one false 911 call, one false alarm, and two traffic complaints.

From the Hall

Terry Elder loved being a Firefighter. Everyone who knew him knew that, but I think the firefighters who served with him knew just how dedicated he was. The big tattoo on his left shoulder showed he was a "lifer" for the depart-

ment. 31 years of combined service on 2 different departments speaks to this dedication. Two service metals. The Governor General of Canada Exemplary Service Metal for 20 years on the department. The Protective Services Metal for 25 years of service from the Provincial Government. Terry wore these metals with great pride. On October 8th he was wearing them when we had the kids from school to the hall for Fire Prevention week. That is just who he was.

Any chance he got to be in the hall, he was there. He helped several times over the years if he could when the kids came that second week of October. He was especially proud to be there when his sons came for the presentations at the hall 6 weeks ago. He was just beaming, and you could see his eyes light up when Aiden and his class came in. He was very attentive to the students' questions and put on his fire gear for some of the classes so they could see what a real firefighter looked like. Terry was trained as a 1001 level 2 Professional firefighter. He gave up a lot of time that winter to achieve this and he was very proud of it. Terry's dedication to our department showed every first and third Tuesday of the month, as he very rarely missed meetings or practices. He wasn't the loudest member on the crew, but he always took part in whatever was going on. Often you would see him taking a younger member aside during a practice, just offering them some advice or words of encouragement. He got along with everyone on the department and could work on a scene with whoever happened to be in the truck he was in.

The last few months were very hard on him. Because of problems with his vision, he couldn't go along on calls. It is hard to explain, but every firefighter can tell you how hard it is to stay at the hall or at home when a call comes in. I know Terry spoke of this often and would often check in if after a call out to see how it went. He hardly missed a meeting in the last few months even though he knew he couldn't go on the call outs. Again, this speaks to his dedication. The last call Terry responded to was a dryer fire at a local business. Like the literally hundreds of calls, he has responded to over the years, Terry did what he always did. He showed up at the hall on a fairly cold winter night, donned his turnout gear and jumped into a truck. The call was not too serious and was dealt with very quickly. Terry got back into the truck and headed back to hall. After every call, all the equipment is cleaned up, hoses are reloaded, trucks fueled up and everything has to be ready for the next call. Terry would always stay and help as he knew this was part of the job. Yes, Terry loved being a firefighter, but there was something he loved more. He loved his wife and 2 boys. He loved spending time with them, be it at the lake in the summer or in the rink in the winter. He would often proudly share updates of his adventures with Jo and the boys in quick conversations we would have after meetings in the hall. He passed his passion for firefighting onto Aiden and Cam. If you were walking by their house, you would often see one of the boys wearing their firefighter gear.

You will be missed at the Fire Hall Terry; Rest easy Number Nine. We will take it from here. Your Duty is done.
