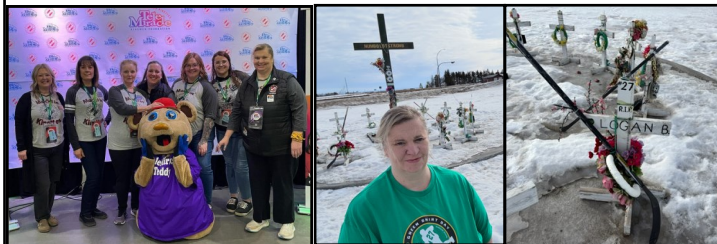

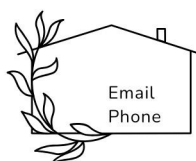

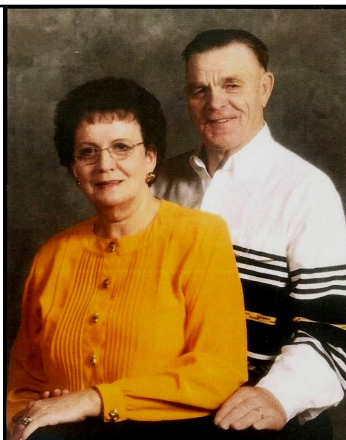

RCMP MACKLIN REPORT February 18 — March 17, 2025

- RCMP issued a Tobacco Act ticket during a traffic stop.

- Police received a complaint of an abandoned vehicle. Members contacted the registered owner who agreed to move the vehicle.

We're getting there. April and Spring can be famous for unpredictable weather. If you are heading out on a trip, watch the forecast. Any kind of moisture or sunny weather can happen quite quickly. Sometimes 4 times in a day. Be prepared!! Don't put your boots away yet!

April can also be the time of year when the ditch grass can get very dry and it won't be long before the spring fire season starts. It is definitely too late to start burning brush piles. We have responded to lots of fires that were started this time of year because we get a little bit of snow. Those brush fires can burn for weeks and that skiff of snow can disappear in 2 days. All it takes is a little bit of wind to stir the ashes up and away the fire goes. We actually responded to a grass fire a few years ago, where the brush pile had been lit that November and the wind stirred it up the following April and we were called out to help control the fire. Please use

common sense when lighting brush fires, burn pits or garbage bins. Monitor them properly.

Call wise, we responded to one single vehicle roll over in the past month. Training wise, we went for our annual winter swim down at the lake on March 18th. You can check out some pictures on our Facebook page from that training session. We also have several members continuing to work towards their NFPA 1001 Certification. They have given up lots of Wednesday evenings this winter and have done some weekend training as well. Thank you for those members for their time and dedication. I believe they are getting very close to doing some of the final testing. Good luck with your exams.
