#### MACKLIN HAS A NUISANCE BYLAW FOR UNKEPT YARDS?

arrived, property owners should ensure their yards are tidy.

Now that the warm weather has **Property owners who do not observe the Town of Macklin** Bylaw are in contravention AND WILL BE issued an Order to Remedy detailing the nature of the contravention(s) and the corrective action(s).

The Town of Macklin Bylaw No. 12/05 known as the Nuisance Abatement Bylaw provides for the abatement of nuisances, including property, activities, or things that adversely affect:

- The safety, health or welfare of people in the neighborhood;
- People's use and enjoyment of their property; or
- · The amenity of a neighborhood.

#### Property owners are required to:

- Regularly remove debris from their yards;
- Maintain vegetation to prevent overgrowth; (cut grass and dispose of, trim trees and shrubs, etc.)
- Dispose of waste and materials;
- Ensure structures such as fences, sheds, and other outdoor installations are kept in good repair.



It is staffed by experienced and specially trained Registered Nurses, Registered Psychiatric Nurses, and Registered Social Workers. HealthLine 811 is free. Services are offered in English, with translation available in over 100 languages.

If you are having technical issues with accessing HealthLine 811 by dialing 811, you can call 1-877-800-0002 to be connected with HealthLine 811. Deaf and hard of hearing residents can access HealthLine 811 by using the SaskTel Relay Operator service at 1-800-855-0511.

#### How does HealthLine 811 work?

When you call 811, a licensed healthcare professional will give you options and information to help you with health or mental health and addictions-related questions or concerns. You will be able to discuss your concerns in a safe, caring, and confidential manner.

A registered nurse will assess your symptoms and help you decide whether to treat your own symptoms, go to a clinic, see your primary health care provider, or access emergency medical care, if necessary.

HealthLine 811 also provides mental health and addictions support. Healthline's registered Psychiatric Nurses and Registered Social workers can offer crisis support, advice to help you manage your situation, and connections to resources in your community.

#### RCMP MACKLIN REPORT April 22 — May 19, 2025

Macklin Detachment: (306) 753—2171 Monday - Friday 8:00am - 12:00 noon

- · RCMP acted as mediators in a family dispute.
- A 34-year-old male from Macklin was charged with Possession of Property Obtained by Crime and Possession of Cocaine for the Purpose of Trafficking, a 52-year-old male from Smiley, Saskatchewan was charged with Possession of Property Obtained by Crime, Fail to Comply with Undertaking Condition and Possession of Methamphetamine, and a 32-year-old male from Lashburn, Saskatchewan was charged with two counts of Possession of Property Obtained by Crime after Members executed a search warrant at a residence. This matter is still under investigation.
- Police received a report of a suspicious substance on a vehicle. Insufficient evidence to proceed.
- RCMP received a complaint of criminal harassment. Members spoke
  to the subjects of complaint and issued a verbal warning.
- Members received a complaint of an individual attempting to steal a truck, but it there was insufficient evidence to proceed.
- Police received a complaint of trespassing. This matter is still under investigation.
- There was also one traffic complaint.
- RCMP received a complaint of a structure fire in a rural area near
   Macklin. The fire was extinguished by Macklin Fire Department and

was not suspicious in nature.

- There was also one traffic complaint and one false alarm.
- RCMP received a complaint of harassing communications but there
  was insufficient evidence to proceed.
- Police received a complaint of fraud. There was insufficient evidence to proceed.
- A 33-year-old female from Macklin was charged with Possession of Cocaine for the Purpose of Trafficking, Possession of Property Obtained by Crime and two counts of Fail to Comply with Release Order Condition after Members executed a search warrant at a Macklin residence. This matter is still under investigation.
- RCMP received a complaint of a dog barking. Members patrolled but could not locate the animal.
- Members received a request to assist another RCMP Detachment in locating a missing person.
- A 72-hour roadside suspension was issued during a traffic stop.
- Police received a complaint of theft of fuel from a local gas station.
   This matter is still under investigation.
- There was also one false 911 call and one traffic complaint.

#### **News from the Hall**

It's 3:01 AM and my wife and I were sleeping very soundly, when we are both woken up by a very loud cell phone alarm. It takes us a few seconds to realize it is the new tone that the Emergency Call Center is using now to call us when we are being dispatched. I check my phone and we are being sent to a structure fire 10 miles out if town. It's strange how hard it is to find your socks at 3:02 in the morning (and I always lay out clothes the night before in case we get a call) but bare feet in fire boots doesn't work for very long. (I found that out the hard way one night) I quickly get dressed and start down the hallway. My wife says, "Be careful", and I hear my daughter call out, "Be safe Dad". Great, so everyone in the house is awake now. I jump in my truck without a jacket because I know my turnout gear is ready at the hall. You get used to backing in to a parking space so you can drive straight ahead if you have to leave quickly.

I get to the hall about 5 minutes after the alarm and several members are already there getting their gear on. Quick decisions are made as to who is in which trucks and who will be donning the air packs in Rescue on the way to the scene. Trucks are leaving the hall in less than 10 minutes. The Command Truck leads the way and Rescue, Engine 1, Engine 2 and a Grassland Truck all respond. We are about 2 miles out of town before I'm finally truly awake and I start planning what to do when we arrive on the scene. I am driving Engine 1 and my job is to get the pump going and get water going down the hoses. We arrive at fire. The chief radios our Call Center and tells them how many trucks and members are on scene. He will be in contact with dispatch every 10 minutes, starting now, giving them a scene up date and member accountability. We park the 2 main Pumper trucks and start pulling hoses. Several members are doing this and the truck operators are starting the pumps. The hoses are attached and the members with air packs grab the hoses and head towards the structure. As they get around to the back side of the building, we see that the power line has dropped down and is arcing out every five seconds or so creating huge welding like flashes and a loud arcing sounds. Don't spray water there! The Chief radios our dispatch and asks them to send SaskPower and SaskEnergy. Both Fire trucks are pumping water in less than three minutes. We realize the fire is mostly in the roof of the structure and ladders are grabbed from the trucks and used to get where we have to be. Four members from Rescue have packs on and 2 enter the structure. 2 remain outside as back up. The entry team quickly realize the fire is mostly in the attic and the do a quick search of the relatively smoke free interior and know that no one is inside. The focus then becomes working from the outside and knocking down the fire. The power has been shut off to the yard and the arcing has stopped. The ambulance and RCMP arrive as they are always automatically dispatched to structure fires. SaskPower and Energy arrive as well and it is now about 4 AM. Both trucks have been pumping water and the fire is getting knocked down fairly quickly. I asked the chief if we should radio for more water trucks and we check the water levels on the new truck (Engine 2) and the gauges have barely moved!! We aren't going to need extra trucks tonight. Engine 1 is getting low on water so we hook up a hose to Engine 2 and fill it while both trucks are still pumping to the fire. When the fire is basically out we get out a Thermal Imaging Camera and start scanning for hot spots. The big light tower on Rescue is setup and lighting the area up because when the fire goes out and the power is off it gets dark.

Things start to slow down now for the first time in about an hour and a half. We have time to grab water bottles and get a drink. Change some of the air bottles on the guys who had air on and check around the building again to make sure no embers have drifted off into the grass. We realize it is a beautiful, calm night and just the right temperature, so that our turn out gear isn't so hot. And no mosquitos!! Hot spots are found and doused with water and checked again with the cameras. We can't find any more heat so we start packing up all our gear and draining and loading the hoses. The Chief radios Dispatch and tells them all Units are returning to the hall. RCMP, Ambulance and the Power and Energy crews have left too. Hey, the sun is starting to come up!! We starting heading back to the Hall. We fill fuel in the trucks that need it on the way back. Engine 1 fills water at hydrant and Engine 2 fills at the hall. While the trucks are filling, all the hoses that got dirty are washed and either put back in the trucks or laid on a drying rack along the back wall. All the air packs are cleaned up and put back in Rescue. The air bottles that were used are filled and put back in the trucks as well. When all the trucks are full of water and gas and everything is ready for the next call, we radio dispatch and tell them we are back in service. Mark time 5:31 AM. We all leave the hall and it is already quite bright out!! 5:30. Perfect! I'll have time for a shower before work!!

Parents will receive a minimum of 30 days notice, regarding these events.

#### Recent Developments

Since our inception, we have made significant progress and implemented numerous improvements, thanks to the hard work and dedication of our staff and volunteers. The Macklin Daycare Committee Board organizes yearly fundraisers to support our financial needs, complemented by specific government grants designated for indoor and outdoor enhancements. These efforts have allowed us to:

Extend our yard

Add turf for expanded play space Install a maintenance-free fence Continuously upgrade toys, play structures, and supplies, etc.





   Examples: Acetone, BBQ lighter fluid, gasoline (in a

#### **Physically Hazardous**

(Fuel cylinders non-refillable - under 5kg)

- Must display the flammable symbol in an octagon and the explosive symbol.
- Examples: Propane cylinders, camp fuel cylinders, MAPP gas torch fuel cylinders.

#### Aerosols

(Flammable, toxic, pesticides, and/or corrosive)

- Must display the explosive and flammable toxic
- Examples: Lubricant spray, glue, insect repellent, brake cleaner. (No cosmetic or beauty products.)

#### **Toxic Liquids**

(Under 10L)

- Must display the poison symbol in an octagon
- Examples: Furniture stripper, automotive additives, lubricants.

#### **Pesticides**

(Liquids and solids - Under 10L/10Kg)

- Must display the poison symbol, a Pest Control Products number, and the word "Domestic."
- Examples: Yard & garden chemicals, anti-fouling paint, sanitizers.

#### Corrosive

(Liquids and solids - Under 10L/10Kg)

- · Must display the corrosive symbol in an octagon.
- Examples: Rust remover, ammonia, bleach.

#### **BASIC RESTRICTIONS:**

- Household waste only (no industrial or agricultural waste).
- · Original containers and labels only.
- · Sealed containers only (must be leak-proof).
- Pesticide containers must show the Pest Control Product number, the word "Domestic." and a toxic symbol.
- Not accepted: Motor oil, antifreeze, ammunition, batteries, caulking compound, cosmetics, diesel, medical sharps, fertilizer, mercury switches.

Please watch for posters around town with more specific items which will be accepted and not accepted.

Also note, if any <u>unaccepted</u> items are brought to the collection site, you will be required to take them with you and dispose of properly.

#### NASP — <u>NATIONAL ARCHERY IN THE SCHOOL PROGRAM</u>

2025 was another successful year for the Macklin School archer's grade 4 through 12. There are 3 divisions, elementary grades 4 and 5, middle grades 6,7 and 8, and senior grades 9, 10, 11, and 12. There are 2 categories bullseye and 3D. In each division the boys and girls compete separately.

At the 2023 provincial tournament in Moose Jaw, Macklin had a senior girl place 9th out of 95. At the 2024 provincial tournament in Moose Jaw Rogan Selzer placed first in both categories in the elementary division. He also placed second and third at the national tournament in Moose Jaw. Kaiden Marsh placed 2nd in the provincial tournament 3D category. At the 2025 provincial tournament in Shaunavon 6 students competed for Macklin on April 11th and 12th. Hudson Stang placed 2nd in the elementary division in both categories. The last archer of the day beat Hudson by 1 point. Macklin school was that close to hanging 2 provincial banners in 2 consecutive years.
