



#### What is HealthLine 811?

Services are offered in English, with translation available in over 100 languages.

If you are having technical issues with accessing HealthLine 811 by dialing 811, you can call 1-877-800-0002 to be connected with HealthLine 811. Deaf and hard of hearing residents can access HealthLine 811 by using the SaskTel Relay Operator service at 1-800-855-0511.

#### How does HealthLine 811 work?

When you call 811, a licensed healthcare professional will give you options and information to help you with health or mental health and addictions-related questions or concerns. You will be able to discuss your concerns in a safe, caring, and confidential manner.

A registered nurse will assess your symptoms and help you decide whether to treat your own symptoms, go to a clinic, see your primary health care provider, or access emergency medical care, if necessary.

HealthLine 811 also provides mental health and addictions support. Healthline's registered Psychiatric Nurses and Registered Social workers can offer crisis support, advice to help you manage your situation, and connections to resources in your community.





#### News from the Hall

Hi All from the Hall.

Welcome to Summer! As am writing this, we are getting a beautiful rain for the first time since the snow melted. It has been very much needed for the crops, lawns and gardens.

With July upon us, school will be out for the summer. Be extra careful when driving around town as you will notice increased foot and bike traffic on the streets now as the young ones start heading to the pool, the park, the playgrounds or their friend's places to have play dates and enjoy the summer holidays. Take a little extra time around intersections and watch out for the children.

Camping season is here also, so if you are heading out make sure your travel vehicles and holiday trailers are in good mechanical condition. Make sure all you lights, signal lights and brakes are all functioning properly. Check the air pressure in the tires and make sure any quads, kayaks, bikes and boats are all fastened down and secure before you head out. It is a good idea to check your loads along the way every time you stop for fuel or a lunch break. Make your self aware of the campfire rules for where you are. Make sure if you are allowed a campfire, that it is properly extinguished before you leave your site or go to bed for the evening. Let's all have a fun and safe summer camping season.

Call wise, we responded to an person injured on a road construction site. We also had a very busy evening/night when we had to respond to 2 mutual aid calls. A mutual aid call is when a neighboring department is dealing with a fairly major incident, so they will request addition support from another department. First we were dispatched to a fire in the Salvador/Denzil area where we worked together with Luseland. That fire was basically contained, when we got a call from Provost to help them with another fire. We drove back from the first fire, stopped in Macklin to refuel the trucks and then off to Provost. On the drive from scene one to scene two, we drove through basically every weather condition Mother Nature could throw at us. Heavy rain, light rain, no rain, hail and almost sunny weather. It was definitely a drive I will remember for a long time. It is the first time I remember doing two mutual aid calls back to back in my time as a volunteer firefighter. It is pretty cool how the communication works with 2 way radios and phones now. The transfer of clear and accurate information between different departments is very important on a night like this.

That's all from the hall. Let's all be happy campers!!





#### **ATV Vehicles**

The use of All Terrain Vehicles is covered under legislation passed by the Province of Saskatchewan and violations of this act are enforced by the local RCMP. Persons owning

and operating any quad, motor bike or other ATV should know what is permitted under this piece of legislation. Please contact any member of the RCMP by calling 753-2171 to discuss your rights as a property owner or ATV owner.

Complaints under the All-Terrain Vehicles Act should be directed to the RCMP. As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.



#### **Recreational Vehicles**

It is unlawful to park any recreational vehicle or trailer (attached or unattached) of any type whatsoever on any

public street or lane in the Town of Macklin for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle or trailer to an off-street location for a period of not less than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle or trailer may be parked again on a residential street.

- NO recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- NO Extensions will be given.
- NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.
- Traffic Tickets will be placed on the unit in violation!

#### ACCEPTED HOUSEHOLD PPRODUCTS

For safety reasons, all products must be in their original container with original label(s) intact to be accepted by the program. We can't accept containers that have no label, are leaking or are improperly sealed.

#### FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS

(Under 10L / 25L for Gas only & Aerosols under 24oz)

- Must display the flammable symbol in an octagon
- Examples: Acetone, BBQ lighter fluid, gasoline (in a ULCapproved can), Paint thinner, etc.

#### PHYSICALLY HAZARDOUS

(Non-refillable fuel cylinders that are under 5kg)

- Must display the flammable symbol in an octagon & the explosive symbol.
- Examples: Propane cylinders, camp fuel cylinders, MAAP gas torch fuel cylinders.

#### **AEROSOLS**

(Flammable, toxic, pesticides, and/or corrosive)

- Must display the explosive & flammable toxic poison or corrosive symbols in an octagon.
- Examples: lubricant spray, glue, insect repellent, brake cleaner. (No cosmetic beauty products).

#### **NOT ACCEPTED PRODUCTS**

- Non-hazardous materials
- Unidentifiable, unknown, unlabeled, and non-original containers
- Leaking or improperly sealed products
- Batteries
- Caulking compound
- Commercial, industrial or agricultural products
- Cosmetics & beauty products (ex: perfume)
- Drugs, medicines & other health products (ex: hand sanitizer)
- Diesel
- Down the drain toxic products
- Medical sharps
- Fertilizer
- Mercury switches
- Oil & antifreeze
- Powder forms of masonry products, cement grout, etc.
- Refillable propane cylinders
- Wine & distilled spirits
- Excludes products with primary intended use of being poured down the drain

#### **TOXIC LIQUIDS**

(Liquids - under 10L & Aerosols under 24oz)

- Must display the poison symbol in an octagon
- Examples: Furniture stripper, automotive additives, lubricants

(Liquids & solids - under 10L/10kg & Aerosols under 24oz)

- Must display the poison symbols, a Pest Control Products number, and the word 'Domestic'.
- Examples: Yard & garden chemicals, anti-fouling paint, sanitizers

#### CORROSIVES

(Liquids & solids - under 10L/10kg & Aerosols under 24oz.)

- Must display the corrosive symbol in an octagon
- Examples: Rust remover, ammonia, bleach.

#### REMINDER WHEN DROPPING OFF PAINT

- Paint must be in its original container, tightly sealed with the labels
- Do not mix different types of paint products together.
- You can bring up to 10 containers of paint or 50 spray cans at a time (no larger than 25L for paint or 24oz for paint aerosols)
- For more than 10 containers of paint or 50 spray cans, please visit productcare.org/saskatchewan
