In honor of her donation and to provide legacy and recognition, the two added bays are going to be called "Batey's Bays!" The timing of this donation could not have been more perfect as the department is currently in need of more room. We have a truck that was donated by Plains Marketing that will be turned into a grass land truck and are also fund raising within the Oilfield community to build a Foam Fire Fighting trailer that will need a home once completed. There will also be a mezzanine for storage and to practice rope rescues off of safely.





TENT CATERPILLARS TREES AND WORMS—WHAT TO DO

Tent caterpillars feed on deciduous trees both ornamental trees and fruit trees. Some of their favorite trees to feed on are aspen, maple, ash, birch, oak, and wild cherry trees. I've found them in our apple and crab apple trees ever year too.

When tent caterpillar populations get large they can cause a lot of damage quickly. To know if these caterpillars are eating your trees look for small holes on the leaves, leaves that are partially eaten from the outside edge, and branches completely stripped of leaves. Of course you want to also look for tent-like nests in the forks of trees. If they are feeding the damage is easily visually in the early summer.

How To Get Rid Of Tent Caterpillars With Dish Soap

Besides cutting off the affected branch, spraying caterpillars with dish soap is another easy way to get rid of them quickly. The key to making a dish soap spray work is to not let the soap foam up to much. Fill the spray bottle up almost full with water, then add 1-2 tablespoons of dish soap per gallon of water. Then finish topping up the water. Give the sprayer a gentle shake to mix the soap in. This helps to suspend the soap in the water without it floating to the top as bubbles. As you find the caterpillar nests you can spray them with soapy water. It also works very well when you have masses of tent caterpillars on your sidewalk and other areas.
