WHO CAN VOTE?

In order to vote in the Town of Macklin municipal election, you must:

- · be a Canadian Citizen;
- at least 18 years of age;
- a Saskatchewan resident for six consecutive months immediately before election day:

<u>AND</u>

 Have resided in the municipality, or on land now in the municipality, for at least three consecutive months immediately before election day;

OR

 Is the owner of assessable land in the municipality, or land now in the municipality, for at least three consecutive months immediately before election day.

WHAT DO I NEED TO VOTE?

All Voters are required to present valid identification.

Accepted identification includes:

 One piece of government issued ID (Driver's License with photo, name, address);

OR

· Two pieces of ID, one with address (birth certificate and utility invoice)

News from the Hall

Hey all from the Hall!

Well we have had a very busy October at the hall. Fire Prevention Week seems to keep things hopping there. I hope you all remembered to check your smoke detectors!! On Thursday Oct 10th we had about 130 students from Pre K to Grade 3 come visit us at the hall. This year we were very lucky and were able to book a public education trailer that has been built by the Kindersley Fire Department. This trailer has a kitchen and a bedroom where you can simulate different conditions. In the kitchen you could "start" an oven fire or a garbage can fire. The students were then shown what to do in these different situations. When the oven started burning inside all they had to do was turn the power off and leave the door closed. If the garbage bin was burning they could use a fire extinguisher to put the fire out. The fire was flashing yellow lights and the extinguisher would shine a green light on the fire and it would go out. In the bedroom we could make smoke start coming in under the door. They were shown how to use whatever was in the room to place along the bottom of the door. They could then feel the back of the door and if it was hot, (And it was) they had to climb out the window. It is a very high tech trailer and a great tool for teaching fire safety and awareness. It was a huge hit with the kids and the teachers. Thank you to the Kindersley Department for building such a great training trailer. Thank you to Jamie Barr for doing the scheduling at the school and for all the teachers, aids and students for making the trip to the hall. After the school kids we had the Daycare children come and tour the hall and see the trucks. They were so much fun. This year we had a new group come and join us at the hall that day as well. Several residents from the Villa Marie came to tour the hall and see the trucks. Several of them said they had never been in a fire hall before. It was a great time and they asked lots of great questions. They had me thinking on a couple of them!! Thank you Karen for arranging to get the residents there!! It was a very busy day and lots of fun for us. Thank you to Amy, Cody, James and Therin for taking a day off and helping get all the kids through the trailer. Wyatt Sieben won the Ride to School in a Firetruck. James and I picked him up Friday Morning

and took him to the hall for a quick tour and then dropped him off at

school. It was great to see Miss King and his classmates waiting and waving on the side walk.

The next day the Chamber of Commerce sponsored an Open House at the Hall. They rounded up a great group of volunteers to barbeque and serve hotdogs and burgers. There were salads, cookies and a special cake was made for the day. The weather was great and the attendance was amazing. About 300 people stopped in that day to enjoy supper, fire hall tours, a jumping tent and the public education trailer was still there and it was kept very busy right from 4 o'clock until 7. It was so great to see so many people come out and support us. Thank you to the Macklin Chamber of Commerce and all the volunteers who helped make it such a great day. There was a donation box set out and a HUGE, HUGE thank you to all the people who made very generous donations. There was over \$8000.00 dollars donated that day!!! All that money will go directly towards purchasing more rescue equipment and finishing the trailer we are going to haul it with.

Also the video done by My Mutual Insurance is now posted on our Facebook page if you want to watch it. It turned out pretty amazing. As you can see we have had a very busy and productive month at the hall. November is now here and you might want to check the condition of your vehicle tires, replace them if necessary or put your winter tires on if you have them. That's all from the hall. Be safe everyone!!


