- Chronic disease management
- Test results

Should you present to the walk-in clinic with an issue listed above, or another matter that does not need prompt attention, you may be asked to book an appointment and return at a later date. If you are unsure or need clarification, please contact the medical clinic.





A heavy call volume takes its toll on our members and equipment but everything is ready to go before we leave the hall. Then when we get home and have our second or third shower of the day and back to other jobs again. Thank you, thank you to all our members. Let's keep on keeping on!!

I would like to thank Chief Justin and Deputy Chief Greg for all the extra work and time they are putting in at the hall trying to keep up with the paper work and making sure the trucks and tools are all ready to go. Thank you also to Stephen Lowe for working on 2 of the trucks that were having issues because of the severe service they have seen recently. He spent at least 5 hours at the hall on a Sunday and over 10 hours another day repairing wiring on one of the units that had an electrical short and burnt up a bunch of wiring. I thought that truck was going to be out of service for several weeks and somehow Stephen had it going by 10:30 that night. To have all our trucks in service is so important right now. Thank you Stephen, Greg and Cam for the extra work on that truck that day. Stephen is also in charge of keeping our Facebook page up to date as well. Thank you for that too Stephen.

Thank you also to the fire board for all the time you donate too. I know the last couple of meetings have been very challenging as well as you try to figure out how to deal with all these events. Your time

and support for our department helps us to get the equipment and tools we need to keep going on. Thank you to all of you. This really helps us continue what we are doing.

Thank you also to our spouses and families who have to listen to door opening and closing at all hours of the day and night. Showers at all hours and helping with the extra laundry that comes home from each call. Your love, support, and understanding is truly helping us get through this!!

Remember it is harvest time again and all the big equipment will be out on the roads at all times of the day and night. Please use extra care and patience around these machines. You can see them but they might not be able to see you. Also (sorry for this kids) but school will be starting up again, so use extra caution when driving while the students are going to and from school!

That's it from the hall. It has been quite a month. Please be safe everyone and let's have a safe harvest season!!!!
