Town of Macklin Public Notice – Zoning Bylaw Amendment

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Town of Macklin intends to adopt a bylaw under *The Planning and Development Act, 2007* to amend Bylaw No. 03/14, known as the Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT

The proposed bylaw will:

- a) Establish an "Animal Hospitals, or clinics and offices of veterinary surgeons" as a Discretionary Use in IND General Industrial District.
- c) Delete the "Animal Hospitals, or clinics and offices of veterinary surgeons" as a Discretionary Use in the C1-Town Centre Commercial District.

REASON

The proposed bylaw would provide the framework whereby an application to locate an "Animal Hospital or Veterinary Clinic" permissible to be considered for development in the industrial district and eliminate the ability for development in the downtown commercial district.

PUBLIC HEARING

Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, January 22, 2024 at 8:00 pm in the Town of Macklin Council Chambers – 5001 Press Avenue to hear any person or group who wishes to comment on the proposed bylaw. Council will also consider written comments received at the hearing or delivered to the Town office to the undersigned prior to the hearing.



NEW YEAR, NEW DOG TAG

Responsibilities of animal owners:

- · All Dogs must be Licensed through the Macklin Town Office yearly
- Animal does Not Run at Large
- Ensure animal does Not enter School ground, playgrounds, sports fields, golf course, cemetery or other areas where prohibited by posted signs.
- Owners who harbor a dog in a front yard or unfenced yard shall ensure animal is kept a minimum of 3 meters from sidewalk/roadway or property line.
- Animal owner shall ensure that if animal defecates on any public or private property other than the property of its Owner, the Owner shall remove such feces immediately.
- Ensure animal does not: bite, bark at, or chase animals, bicycles, automobiles or persons.
- Contact that Town of and changes to you animal record.
