### WHEN IT SNOWS..... WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH THE SNOW FROM MY DRIVEWAY?

It is the policy of the Town of Macklin to clear snow from all emergency, business and school bus routes as first priority.

When clearing the snow from your sidewalks or driveway, please make sure to deposit this snow onto your own property.

By blowing, shoveling, or moving the snow from your driveway or sidewalk onto the street, you are compounding what already is a daunting task.

Your assistance when removing your snow will allow the Town maintenance staff to quickly and efficiently clean snow from our streets. Please make sure you are visible and give plenty of distance to Town snow removal equipment

#### **News from the Hall**

Hey All. I hope the cold snap has passed us by the time you are reading this!! Those were some of the most extreme temperatures and wind chill ratings that I can remember. Temperatures like that can change a simple everyday occurrence into a very dangerous situation in a matter of seconds. Let me use an example. Imagine someone is driving home in the dark with 2 other passengers. Suddenly a moose walks out on the highway and is hit by the car. The moose rolls up over the hood and breaks out the windshield and the windows of both front doors of the car as well. (Trust me, this can happen) Now you are sitting in a car that can't drive and the front 3 windows are gone. The car will start getting very cold, very quickly. What are you going to do?? Another example, is what just happened this winter in Kentucky. A major snow storm happened and several motorist were forced to spend more than 12 hours on the highway that night. Are you prepared for something like this? What would you do?? This is why we encourage you to carry a winter emergency kit in your car. Extra blankets and extra winter cloth such as boots, mitts toques etc. This will definitely help you in the short term until help can get to you.
