#### **Disaster!**

Earthquakes, tidal waves, fiery infernos, sharks, piranhas and an upside-down casino were all witnessed by a laughing audience during the Macklin Adult Community Drama Group's performance of "Disaster!" on April 19, 20 and 21.

This slap-stick juke-box comedy was filled with well-known songs from the 70's. The play begins on opening night of the Barracuda, a floating casino, owned by Tony, a sleazy businessman who was hilariously played by Shane Campbell. We are quickly introduced to Marianne (Ashley Spykerman, who has the ability to nail every role given to her), a reporter trying to get the goods on Tony's corrupt ways and her former love interest, Chad (Perry Stang, consistently a crowd favourite), who is now a waiter on the Barracuda. Prof. Ted Scheider, (portrayed by Jeremy Vokins,

whose energy and enthusiasm is contagious) is investigating the possibility of a disastrous earthquake which could be triggered by any loud, noise – singing, dancing, slot machines. No casino would be complete without a lounge singer, played by Celine Vokins who captured the "You're beautiful, It's not you fault you're easily fooled" persona perfectly and her twins Ben and Lisa who were both portrayed amazingly by Kadeja Vokins.

Included were a number of very interesting patrons to the casino – a nun with a gambling addiction, played by Kira Scott who stole the show with her comedic timing and fantastic voice, a retired

couple, Maury and Shirley (Don Golden and Della Stang), whose dance number was a crowd favourite, a former disco star Levora Verona, played by Denise Feser, who always does a wonderful job with her character. Of course there are many other patrons, Rayna Germann, Donna Burningham, Myrna, Syang, Derra Gartner, Andy Scott, Katherine Vanhouwe and Cole Oleson. These ensemble members were essential to this show portraying various characters and providing amazing back-up vocals.

#### A Flaming Hot Time at Macklin's First Chili Cook-Off

Macklin & District's first ever annual Chili Cook-Off, hosted by the Youth Group of Evesham Community Church, was a massive hit. On March 24<sup>th</sup>, community members from Macklin and district came out in large numbers to enjoy different chilis and to vote for their favorite pot of chili. This enabled the Youth Group to raise a total of \$2,008.00, far exceeding their fundraising goal of \$700.00.

A total of 12 teams competed for the title of Chili Cook-Off Winner. Teams from Senlac, Luseland, Evesham, and Macklin all entered their best chili dish. The aroma from the steaming pots of chili filled the room as community members tasted dishes ranging from mild to spicy classic chilis, along with sweet and sour chili, and chili made with chicken, pulled pork, and steak. The dessert table was a big hit, and the cherry on top for many people.

After counting all of the votes, Time of Your Life Entertainment from Luseland was announced as the winner of the chili cook-off. The winning team received a floating trophy and a keeper plaque. Eric Beyer from Macklin was voted runner-up. Rita Davis from Time of Your Life Entertainment described the chili cook-off as "such an amazing day". She said they had some great chili and that she can't wait for the Youth Group's chili cook-off next year. "It is a great group of kids", she added.

The Youth Group of Evesham Community Church donated the money they received to Medair, a charity providing emergency relief and rehabilitation to communities and children in need and affected by conflicts and disasters. Willem Hoogstad, Youth Group member, thanked everyone in the community who supported the fundraiser, whether by entering a pot of chili, buying tasting tickets, or donating directly. Lohan Linde, another Youth Group member, said he had a lot of fun and was already looking forward to next year's fundraiser. #### **News from the Hall**

It is nearly impossible to describe the feeling you get when you are standing in a grain bin of wheat and the bottom door is opened. It takes a split second to realize that you are actually starting to sink and within 2 seconds you are down past your knees and if someone doesn't stop that grain flow with in seconds, you will be buried up to your waist or higher. At this point it is extremely unlikely that you will be able to free yourself. The more you move the more the grain packs in around you. You will need help. If someone can't stop that grain flow within 5 to 10 seconds, you will be completely submerged and your chance of survival basically disappears. That is right!! 5 to 10 seconds. Now these times will vary somewhat based on grain type, bin size and the type and size of the auger being used to move the material, but believe me it happens very fast. I have been lucky enough to have taken several courses over the past 25 years but none of them made as much of an impact on me as this one did. The Grain Rescue Awareness Course for Firefighters is the training that 16 members of Macklin and District Fire Rescue and 4 members of the Provost Fire Department recently participated in on April 13<sup>th</sup>. The Canadian Agricultural Safety Association (CASA) has built a special training trailer that travels from BC To Ontario and we were fortunate that they could were able to do the course right here in town. All 20 members that took the course had their turn to get sunk down into the grain and the rest of us practiced using the equipment designed to do this type of rescue. If you have read some of my previous letters you will know that there was a successful rescue performed not too far from us. Dan, our trainer was the same man who trained these other departments so he made the training very realistic. Each session started with a member standing on the grain and then the door on the bottom was opened an they were pulled down into the grain. (Everyone in the bin was tethered with a safety harness) Then we would take 4 curved 5' high pieces of metal and build a tube around the "victim" and start pushing it down around them. A mini drill powered auger was then used to lower the grain level in the "cofferdam". We could keep pushing the dam down and augering out grain until the member could free themself. There are ladders built around the inside of the cofferdam and that helps the person climb out. The grain level was lowered just about down to my knees before I could actually free myself. It is an incredible experience to feel trapped and know that at this point you are relying on someone else to help you get out. As someone who grew up on a farm this course was extremely eye opening. The big take aways from the day of training were:

NEVER enter a grain bin or grain truck when there is grain moving in that space. Never enter a bin without having someone else outside the bin that can monitor your safety. Never stand on top of bridged grain as it could be hollow underneath. Never enter a bin that has heated grain in if the grain is bridged up on one side. The bin could collapse because of uneven load pressures on the wall or the wall of grain could break lose and cover you within seconds. NEVER let children play in bins or trucks with grain in. Most of these types of accident happen during the busy seasons on the farm when people are in a hurry and not thinking through what they are doing. Training days like this are very valuable and this one made a huge impact on me. A course like this and the equipment used to do these types of rescues do not come without a cost. The course with the trainer and trailer for a day was \$2500.00 and the equipment we used starts at around \$5000.00 but can go a lot higher with safety harnesses, winches etc. We have some very generous donations already and are in the process of ordering the cofferdam and mini auger. Macklin and District Fire and Rescue would like the thank the following for their generous donations: Bumper To Bumper Macklin, Rose Bast, Daley Brothers, Kohlman Trucking, Wade and Susan Sumner, The Coop #414416, Synergy Credit Union, Raymond Farkas and Neil and Debbie Burwash. Also a big thank you to Bill Stang for bringing in the wheat to fill the trailer and then hauling it home again. We could not have done the training without it. If you or anyone you know would be interested in offering financial support, please feel free to contact myself or any other member of our department. Tax receipts can be issued.

Call wise, we had our first big grass fire of the season and neighboring departments have respond to several already. Please refrain from burning anything until we get a big rain and the conditions start to green up. Be fire smart!!! And be safe everyone!!
