Macklin Medical Clinic Update

We would like to thank our local Medical Clinic Board for purchasing a 24-hour Ambulatory Blood Pressure Monitor for use at our clinic.

Ambulatory blood pressure monitoring is a method to measure your blood pressure on a continuous basis for 24 hours. After wearing the monitor for 24 hours, the results are downloaded onto software at the clinic. The data is beneficial in guiding treatment options. Our Physician or NP will determine if this testing is needed.

This monitor serves as a great diagnostic tool and our patients will no longer have to drive to North Battleford or Provost for this service.

The weekly walk-in clinic has been well used to date. (Monday afternoons 1:00 – 3:00, doors open at 12:50, and last patient seen will be at 2:45.)

We would like to remind everyone that even though wait times at local clinics may be lengthy, the walk-in clinic is **not** meant for prescription renewals, chronic disease management, discussing test results, SGI Medicals, wart treatments, and other non-urgent issues. Your pharmacist is able to offer treatment for many minor ailments, and will also extend most prescriptions until an appointment with your healthcare provider is available. If you are a regular patient at another clinic, please continue to seek service from the physician or NP at that clinic, however, we do welcome new patients that would like to transfer to our clinic. Continuity of care is not only vital to overall health and well-being, but it stabilizes the patient load at our clinic which helps us to serve you better.

- RCMP received a report of a vehicle collision with a streetlight. This matter is still under investigation.
- Members received a Mental Health Act complaint. This matter is still under investigation.

ONLINE CRIME REPORTING

Unity RCMP are reminding people that Online Crime Reporting has been created for Saskatchewan residents to report crime in a way that is convenient, modern, and accessible. By redirecting certain crime types through this online platform, we can shift some of the workload away from front line personnel. **The website can be visited at:**

What types of crime can be reported online through the OCR tool and processed by the CBU?

- ◆ **Fraud & Scams:** any type of fraud that is under \$5,000 (e.g. CRA scams, compromised personal identity information, internet/telephone-based frauds, etc.).
- ◆ **Vandalism Damage:** any type of damage to property that is under \$5,000 (e.g. Canada Post mailboxes, fence spray painted, oil field sites, etc.).
- ◆ **Lost & Stolen Property:** any type of stolen or lost property under \$5,000 (e.g. theft from a motor vehicle – including catalytic converters or car batteries, theft of mail, bikes, copper wire, etc.).
- ◆ **Traffic Offences:** traffic complaints when direction of vehicle is unknown, the licence plate unknown, or incomplete vehicle description (e.g. loud muffler, stunting/erratic driving, speeding, etc.).
- ◆ **Harassing Phone Calls or ECommunication:** involves social media or text messaging. *Does not include threats of violence or sextortion.

If the incident being reported meets the one of the above criteria but there is a witness or suspect, the public is being directed to report the crime to their local RCMP detachment.

News from the Hall

Hello All from the hall.

Well that was fun!! 2025 Fire Prevention Week has come and gone again for another year. It was a busy, but fun week. On Tuesday, Justin and I went to the Villa and spoke to the residents and staff about fire safety. The theme this year was "Charge into fire safety: Lithium Ion batteries in your home". We talked to them about the proper use of chargers for phones and tablets, and reminded them to only charge devices on flat hard surfaces. They all listened very attentively and had some very good questions afterwards. I was even invited to one of the residents rooms as they had more questions and they wanted to make sure they were doing things correctly. We also talked to them about what they should do when the smoke alarms go off in the building. It was a very rewarding experience and I think we all learned something that day.

On Wednesday, we had just under 120 kids from the school and daycare come visit us at the hall. Each class came with their teachers and aides and the older ones were invited up to our meeting room for a quick lesson. We talked to them about how a fire drill at home should be the same as the fire drills they do at school. When the smoke detectors go off they should all get out of the house and go to a "meeting place". Just like they do at school. We had some really good discussions as to why it is so important for the whole family to know where to go when the alarms sound. After talking to them about the escape plan, we talked about the importance of staying low and going to the door, feeling the door to see if it is hot and then going out side to the meeting place. We had a little table, lamp and cot set up in the room so we asked for a student volunteer to see what they would do if something happened while they were sleeping. When the student was laying in the bed we waited for a while, and then we turned on a smoke machine we had hidden under the cot. When the smoke came out (It is actually a fog machine that produces non toxic "Smoke") we waited a few seconds and then sounded the smoke alarm. The student would then wake up, go to the door and exit the room. All the students watching got very excited and offered up opinions on what was done right and what they could have done differently. It is harder to think straight and fast when a smoke detector is going off and there is smoke in the room. After they did their lesson we took them back downstairs and let them see the trucks and answered any questions they had. We also got one of the firefighters to put on all their turn out gear so the children could see what we might look like if we come into the school or their house in the event of a fire. The daycare kids and the pre k and kindergarten kids didn't get the lesson up in the meeting room but we talked about the importance of working smoke alarms. We showed them what a firefighter looks like in turn out gear and stressed to them that a firefighter is your friend and you shouldn't hide from them if there is smoke in the school or your home. We also showed them the trucks and flashings lights and we even sounded the sirens for them when they left.

I would really like to thank the teachers for making time in their busy school schedules for bringing the students to the hall. I hope you all had fun and learned something that day. We sure did! Thank you to Terry, Cody, Mihai, Greg and Justin for taking some time to come and help with the lessons. All the teachers who brought their students, also brought a class list and from all the names one was drawn for a

ride to school if the fire truck of their choosing. This year we picked up Emelia at her house (She was even dressed as a firefighter) before school with the Rescue Van and took her to the Firehall. We showed her all the trucks and asked which one she wanted to ride to school. She asked which is the biggest one? We showed her Engine 2. "I'll take that one!!" She said. So Amy and I got her in the truck and went down the highway a little way and turned on the sirens for her. She kept on saying how much fun this was and how awesome it was. She sure made it fun for us too. Then we pulled up to school a 8:45 and let her turn on the lights and siren again. Her class and another class were waiting on the sidewalk and everyone was smiling and cheering. It was a really fun morning!! Thank you Amy for helping with this.

Call wise. It has been quite busy with combine and field fires but most haven't been too bad. There was a mold or fungus in the canola this year that really stuck to the combines and if it got near the exhaust or if there was a static spark it could start burning. In most cases the combine wasn't even damaged but it is very tense for a while for the operator. Unfortunately one combine was a total loss. It is the first time in 28 years on the department that I have seen conditions like this.

That's all from the Hall. Be safe everyone until next time!!

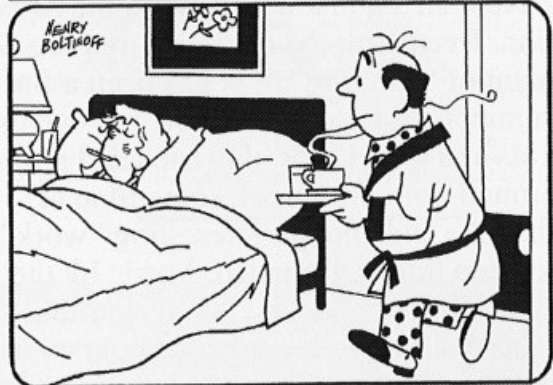

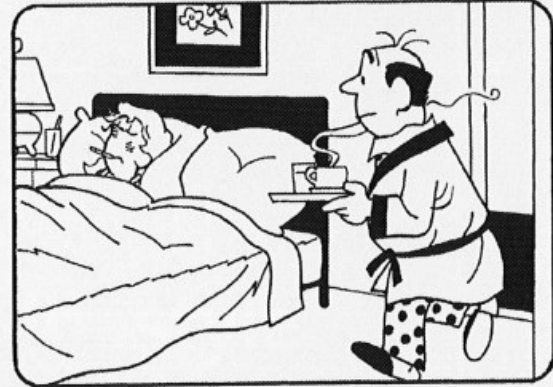
